Enoch Town

Incorporation : A delegation from the Community of Enoch consisting of the following members; J. Stanford Jones, J. Hunter Gibson and Norman Grimshaw; met with the Commissioners and presented for their consideration, the following petition:

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF IRON COUNTY, STATE OF UTAH:

WHEREAS, the people of Enoch, residing within the limits of the proposed corporate boundries hereinafter set out, number not less than one hundred persons; and

WHEREAS, the majority of the duly qualified electors of Enoch, resident within the boundries of the proposed corporation hereinafter designated, believing that substantial benefits will accrue to the people of said area as a result thereof, are desirous of having the Board of County Commissioners of Iron County, State of Utah, constitute said area and the inhabitants thereof in said community a body corporate and politic and an incorporated town,-

NOW THEREFORE, we, the undersigned, constituting a majority of the duly qualified electors of the Town of Enoch, residing within the boundries hereinafter designated, do hereby respectively petition the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Iron County, State of Utah, to constitute, designate and declare the area within the following described limits as shown upon

the plat hereto attached, and the inhabitants thereof, a body corporate and politic and an incorporated town under the name and style of ENOCH TOWN CORPORATION and to appoint a board of Trustees consisting of a President and four Trustees from the qualified electors residing in said area, who shall hold office until their successors are duly elected and qualified in accordance with law, said town corporation to continue until dissolved in accordance with law; said areas being particularly described as follows, to-wit:-

Upon motion of Commissioner Ivan M. Matheson, duly seconded by Commissioner Norman H. Day, the following resolution was unanimously passed and adopted by the Board of Commissioners of Iron County, Utah, to-wit:-

WHEREAS, a Petition has heretofore been duly filed with the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners of Iron County, Utah which said Petition bears the signature of Thirty-five (35) of the qualified electors of Enoch, which said number constitutes a majority of the qualified electors of the area designated in said Petition and in which said Petition said qualified electors petition and request that the said area designated in said Petition, and the people within said area, be constituted, designated and declared to be a body corporate and politic and an incorporated town.

AND WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners have examined the contents of said Petition and have duly considered the same and have found that said Petition meets the requirements of the law.

AND WHEREAS, said Board of County Commissioners of Iron County, Utah, feel that it would be to the benefit, advantage and the best interests of the people residing within said area to have said area and the people residing within said area duly constituted a body corporate and politic and an incorporated town.

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of County Commissioners, do hereby constitute, designate, declare, and set apart the said area described in said Petition, and the people residing within said area, as a body corporate and politic and an incorporated town, to remain in existence until dissolved in accordance with law.

Said Petition is hereby referred to and the same is hereby made a part of this resolution by reference.

Said area to be embraced and included within said incorporated town is described as follows, to-wit:-

An additional motion was passed in connection with this matter, made by Commissioner Matheson and seconded by Commissioner Day, appointing J. Stanford Jones as President of the Town Board, with J. Hunter Gibson, F. Hunter Grimshaw, Dee H. Wilcken and Loleen N. Grimshaw as members.

Road : Attention of the Board was called to the need for widening the culvert located South of the Dave Murie residence. Authorization was given Supervisor of Roads, Mr. J. A. Pace, to install a small section.

Extension Service : Dr. Marden Broadbent of the Utah State University, and County Agent Wallace Sjobolom, informed the County Commissioners that funds had been made available to them to cover necessary salaries in connection with the hiring of two specialists in the Fields of Community Resources Development and City Zoning and Planning. They proposed to place these people in the Five County Organization would agree to pay necessary expenses in connection with their assignments and functions and they desired to know the attitude of the Iron County Commissioners, as a member of F. C. O., with respect to this matter.

In response to questions from the Board, Dr. Broadbent explained the proposed activities of these people to be briefly as;

(1) Community Resource Development:

To work with Chambers of Commerce, Community Development and Action Groups, City and County Representation, Technical Action Panels, et., al.

As a member of U. S. U. Extension Services he would be part of the Resources of present University offerings -- but spending full time to;

Organize social power structure to analyze present community services; analyze present basic resources (water, land and people-- social and economic resources--) to utilize all agencies and power in weighing community alternatives for feasible and beneficial renewal and development and use of potential resources -- and to create action programs for community motivation to pursue potentials on a

"determined" basis of importance. This entire work would be under the close cooperation with County Commissioners or their delegated representatives.

Such action would bring together social groups for "long-range" community programming and action -- which would utilize all available resources which would assist in accomplishing the objectives of such a program in recognition of major community problems and potentials.

This activity would open the way for beneficial "Zoning and Planning" and develop an area framework around which action to renewal, development and decision making could be done.

II. City Zoning and Planning:

Work with County Commissioners, assessors, surveyors, engineers-- City Government and local "community Action groups". As an integral part of U. S. U. Extension he would work in harmony with present staff to develop community and county proposals for orderly development of land use, business establishment, land taxation and regulation, public utilities and services (roads, parks, recreation, mountain and leisure house, sanitation and sewage disposal, buildings and subdivisions, etc.)

Such would be a public and private developmental "framework" which would give consistency and orderliness to "long-time" developments and renewal as envisioned for communities and counties, of the Five County Area.

After considerable discussion, this matter was tabled for further consideration.

Home Agent

: Dr. Broadbent and Mr. Sjobolom also informed the Commissioners that the Iron County Home Agent had resigned and that they were in the process of obtaining a replacement. Commissioner Matheson inquired as to the Possibility of obtaining one on a part time basis. They replied that this possibility was being explored.

Assurance of Compliance

: Mr. Jack B. Shumate and Foyer Olson of the Forest Service met with the Commissioners as Permittees, relative to the obtaining of signed assurances of compliance in connection with regulation under Title VI of the Civil Rights Acts of 1964. Such assurance of Compliance was signed and delivered.

Roads

: They also discussed with the Board a previously proposed arrangement by and between the Forest Service and the County to exchange, on the basis of convenience of location, maintenance of roads. Both parties seemed to feel that such an agreement would work to the advantage of each and that

a formal agreement should be worked out.

Civil
Defense :

H. E. Christensen, Iron County Civil Defense Director, and James A. Bailey and Frances Childs of Armco Corporation, called on the Commissioners relative to the installation of a Civil Defense storage building. Mr. Christensen explained to the Board that the bid of Armco (\$2703.00) was low on the type of building he desired and he recommended it be accepted. After some discussion as to the detail, on motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Day, this recommendation was approved.

Director Christensen was also authorized to accept a 1957 Chevrolet pickup and a Jeep which he said was available to him through government surplus.

Teletype :

Sheriff Otto Fife explained to the Commissioners that there was a proposal on the State level to establish a State Clearing House for teletype and that if and when such center is established, he would like authority to cooperate with Cedar City and the Highway patrol (1/3 to each) in the cost of maintaining a Teletype at Cedar City. He stated that this would not exceed \$25.00 per month. A motion was passed, made by Commissioner Day and seconded by Commissioner Matheson granting such authority.

Gasoline :

Sheriff Fife was also authorized to accept the low bid submitted in response to calls for bids to furnish gasoline for the sheriff's Department, should all bids be received before the next regular commissioners meeting.

Planning

Commissioners: On motion of Commissioner Matheson, seconded by Commissioner Day with all Commissioners voting in favor thereof, the following named persons were appointed to a four year term on the County planning Commission:

Five
County:

Attention of the Commissioners was called to the fact that Iron County lacked representation on two committees of the Five County Organization. Thereupon a motion was duly passed which was made by Commissioner Day and seconded by Commissioner Matheson appointing Theral L. McArthur to advertising and Adrian Baldwin to Parks and Forests.

Convention : On motion of Commissioner Matheson, seconded by Commissioner Day, with all Commissioners voting in favor thereof, all County Officers

desiring to attend the State Convention of County Officers, Jan.18 to 21st, were authorized to do so. Expense allowance of \$90.00 per officer was approved.

Hopper

Control:

A motion was passed, made by Commissioner Matheson and seconded by Commissioner Day, authorizing the County Treasurer to cancel Hopper Control expense levied against Eloda B. Newberger and Gloria B. Anderson for the year of 1965, Kanarraville area.

Water &

Equipment

: On motion of Commissioner Day, seconded by Commissioner Smith, with the vote thereon being unanimous, Commissioner Matheson was authorized to enlarge the Coal Creek Water Application and to purchase a blade for tractor to be used in snow removal at the Valley View Medical Center.

Roads

: In response to a request from the Road Committee of the Five County Organization, the Commissioners listed the road from Cedar Breaks to Panguitch Lake as their selection of the one most deserving at the present time of a top priority listing on the road program of the said organization.


Lease

: The application of Thelmar Stratton for a one year lease from date of some 40 acres of land owned by the County in Section 3, T36S, R11W, S1M. for a fee of \$10.00 was considered and approved.

: After the bills against the County were either approved or rejected, the meeting was adjourned.

REGULAR FEBRUARY 1966 MEETING

Minutes of meeting of the Board of County Commissioners held in the Courtroom of the County Courthouse at Parowan, Utah, February 14th, 1966, beginning at the hour of 9 A. M.

Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

AGING COUNCIL : Attention of the Board was called to the fact that some appointments were due and necessary in connection with the aging Council. Mr. Larson was moving away and therefore could not continue to serve, Mr. Rowleys term had expired and there was the annual shift from the Sons of the Utah Pioneers and the daughters as between Parowan and Cedar City. To care for this matter the Commissioners appointed the following persons:

Jess W. Guymon from Sons of the Pioneers at Parowan.

Albert Albertson, to replace Mr. Larson.

Jean Hendrickson, as County Representative.

Zesta Dalley, from Daughters of Utah Pioneers, Cedar City.

STATE ROADS : A request from the State Road Commission for an appointment for representatives from their Department to meet with the Board at 2 O'Clock P. M. March 14th, was approved.

ROAD SHEDS : Mayor Ralph S. Orton reported to the Commissioners that the State Road Commission had abandoned its old Road Sheds South of Parowan, and had asked Parowan City if they were interested in renting them. Mr. Orton stated that the City was not interested and in turn wanted to know if the County was. He was advised by the Board that they were where upon the Mayor stated that he would follow through on the matter and advise of necessary action.

LIBRARIES : County Auditor was authorized to distribute \$10,589.00 as the County portion of Cost of operating Libraries for the year of 1966, two thirds to Cedar City and one third to Parowan City.

RADIO : A letter from Parowan City requesting that the County turn

to them a two way Radio which they understood was in possession of the Sheriffs Department and not being used, to be placed in their Fire Truck. Sheriff Fife was contacted by the Commissioners regarding the matter and he advised them that the Radio was needed by his Department and that he did not wish to release it.

UTAH STATE UNIVERSITY : The proposal of the Utah State University to place two additional Agents in the Five County Area, was again discussed by the Commissioners, and they still were of the opinion that to do so would overlap existing services and require expending of Funds not at present available.

WEED ERAD. PROGRAM : An agreement from the Iron County ASCS was presented to the Board in which their cooperation was sought to specified degrees in the Noxious Weed program as conducted by the said ASCS. After a discussion of the matter they concluded to go along with the program and signed the agreement.

ROAD MATTER : Matter of Road in Escalante Valley from the Enterprise Road West to Farms in the Zuckerman Area, came before the Commissioners for consideration. Interested parties were to be advised that the County is willing to provide the necessary Road as soon as workable provided four Rod rights of way are first obtained.

FLOOD CONTROL : A request from the Coal Creek Irrigation Company for assistance from the County in a Flood Control project was considered. in Cedar Valley, Commissioner Matheson was authorized to arrange a meeting of all parties concerned to further consider the matter.

LITTLE LEAGUE : George Loosley met with the Board seeking their assistance in connection with the building of a Little League Base Ball Dimond in the Parowan area. Mr. Loosley was assured that they, the Commissioners, would lend assistance in the nature of Equipment, when available, provided the basic and necessary community planning is first satisfactorily worked out as between and among all groups interest in the project.

BIDS ON SHERIFFS CAR. : There were two bids received in response to the County Invitation to Bid on a Car for the Sheriffs Department.

These bids were opened and read aloud and were as follows:

A motion was duly passed which was made by Commissioner Matheson and seconded by Commissioner Day to the effect that in as much as both units meet specifications, the bid of Thorley Motor Company be accepted.

WEED SUPV.

SALARY MATTER : Mr. Drex Adams of Cedar City, supervisor of the Weed Control program of Iron County for the year of 1965, met with the Board with respect to plans and arrangements for the year of 1966. He explained that, due to the nature of the Spraying program, hours, public relations etc, he would rather continue his work with the Road Department at the rate of pay he is now receiving than to go onto the Weed work at a like scale of pay which he did for 1965. After some discussion, a motion was passed which was made by Commissioner Day and seconded by Commissioner Matheson, offering Mr. Adams \$2.46 per hour, pay for the hours worked, and after the spraying program is complete for the season of 1966 and he returns to the Road Department, he is to accept the rate of pay the Job provides. Mr. Adams accepted arrangement as provided by the motion .

On motion of Commissioner Matheson seconded by Commissioner Day, with all Commissioners voting in favor thereof, County Road Supervisor Pace, was authorized to look into the possibility of repairing the old Weed Truck in order to avoid, if possible, the cost of a new or better truck for seasonal work.

JAIL BUILDING

AT PAROWAN. : Mayor Ralph S. Orton of Parowan City, advised the Board that it was agreeable with the City should the County decide to repair the Basement of the Jail Building as a storage facility for old records, if the City could be provided with a section thereof for some of their old Records. Costs to be shared 3/5 County, 2/5 City.

CITY LIBRARY

: Mayor Orton also reported to the Commissioners that shelving, landscaping, and other additions were needed in connection with the new Library Building, some of which projects were now in progress, and wished to know the manner in which the County wished to handle their share of payments. He was advised by the Commission, that a copy of the billings should be submitted to the County and they would pay to the City, at ratio agreed upon, their proportionate share up to maximum budgeted for the project.

JUNKET : County Attorney Robert L. Gardner applied for permission to attend the annual Convention of Public Prosecutors during the early part of March. Approval was given by the Commission provided the expenses of the trip could be covered by the Budget provided and approved for the Attorneys Department.

After the bills against the County had either been approved or rejected, the meeting was adjourned.

KUED

TELEVISION : The Commissioners considered and approved a request; contained in a letter from H. W. Haltshouser, chief Engineer University Radio and Television Service; that the Counties execute an Agreement authorizing the University, through KUED, to assume full responsibility for the maintenance of the Backbone System of Channel Seven (7) and to pay costs incurred, within the limitations of Budget as provided by Senate Bill #154, without prior approval from the Counties. The Agreement granting such authority was signed by Commission Chairman Smith and returned to Mr. A. P. Christensen, ETV Committee Secretary, Fillmore, Utah.

TAX MATTER : Mr. Stanford Jones of Enoch, requested that he be relieved from being required to pay delinquent personal property taxes on Livestock and Equipment which had been assessed in connection with Real Property which he had previously sold and which it was now necessary for him to re-possess. The personal property not being his but belonging to the purchaser. The Commissioners rejected the request for the reason that when the attachments were made the procedure was proper based on terms and conditions of the Sale.

STATE

LABORATORY ; Attorney Robert L. Gardner, presented a Resolution to the Board for their consideration, petitioning his Honor, Calvin L. Rampton, Governor of the State Of Utah, to restore the State Labortory at the Valley View Medical Center at Cedar City, Utah. After reading the said Resolution, on motion of Commissioner Ivan Matheson, seconded by Commissioner Day, with all members voting in favor thereof, the Resolution was adopted, approved and ordered mailed to the Governor.

JUNKET : Commissioner Ivan M. Matheson was authorized to attend meeting of Committee studying proposals of Little Hoover Commission, April 7th, 1966, in Salt Lake City.

JUSTICE OF
THE PEACE :

A letter was received from Mrs. Aliene Smith, President of the Escalante Valley Coordinating Council, requesting the Commissioners consider the appointment of a Justice Of The Peace for their area, and suggested that Mr. James C. McGarry be the appointee. After some discussion, the Board expressed themselves as having no objection to making such appointment but suggested that the Council more fully advise them as to the need before they give the matter further consideration.

PLANNING

COMMISSION : A motion was passed, which was made by Commissioner Matheson and seconded by Commissioner Day, appointing Arnold O. Gurr of the County Planning Commission to a four year term on its Board Of Adjustment.

COUNTY ROAD: Request of Deward Schoppman of Cedar City, for assistance in Road repair on the Old Milford Road in the Escalante Valley, was tabled to give time in which to investigate the matter before any definite action is taken.

CITY AND

COUNTY BLDG: Mr. Claude Macfarlane, Jailer and Custodian at the City and County Building at Cedar City, met with the Board to report need for repair of the Building and Facilities, and as well, to request the assistance of an additional man on a two day per week basis. Chairman Smith was directed to meet with the City Council of Cedar City at their next regular Meeting to try and work out an agreeable solution to both matters.

QUIT CLAIM

DEED : A motion was passed which was made by Commissioner Day and seconded by Commissioner Matheson, authorizing the issuance of a Quit Claim Deed, for the purpose of removing a Cloud from the Title, covering the following described property:

CIVIL DEFENSE: Mr. H. E. Christensen, Iron County Civil Defense Director, reported to the Commissioners regarding the sale of a Jeep, which was surplus Civil Defense Property, to Mr. Adrian Baldwin, of Cedar City. Some matters of procedure were advanced and discussed, following which the matter was referred to the County Attorney and Mr. Christensen for study, and recommendation.

STATE FORESTRY : Mr. Paul Sjoblom and Assistant of the State Forestry and Fire Control Department, met with the Commissioners for the purpose of discussing and obtaining signed approval of their Budget in Iron County for 1966 and of explaining the proposed program for the year. Subject of available surplus property was discussed including the possibility of some being available that might be used as assistance in Fire Control at the Cedar City Airport. Mr. Sjoblom was advised by the Commission that this later matter is one which should first be discussed with the Cedar City Officials.

ROAD MATTER : Scott Barton, Val Barton and Lester C. Williamson appeared before the Board seeking assistance from the County relative to the improvement of a Road in the Paragonah Farming area. After considerable discussion, they received assurance from the Commissioners that the County would cooperate in the matter as soon as equipment is available, and to the extent compatible with demands of other programmed projects. This assurance was conditional however, upon the obtaining of proper and necessary right of way.

JAIL INSPECTION: Upon recommendation of Sheriff Fife, the \$5.00 per month fee heretofore paid to Stan Davis as Jail Inspector, was directed to be paid to Kent Hoyt.

After bills against the County had either been approved or rejected, the meeting was adjourned.

ASSISTANT CUSTODIAN : Chairman Smith reported that, in accordance with a previous assignment, he had checked with Cedar City regarding purported needed repairs at the City and County Building, and the matter of a part time assistant Custodian and Jailer. He stated that they had resolved the latter problem by hiring Horace Miller as an assistant to Claude Macfarlane at a salary of \$1,500.00 per year. Cedar City to pay one half and the County to pay one half. Problems related to the Building had not been settled.

HOME DEMONSTRATION AGENT: County Agent, Wallace Sjoblom met with the Board for the purpose of introducing the new Home Demonstration Agent, Mrs. Kathryn Castleton. Mr. Sjoblom explained that she had just recently been appointed to fill the vacancy which came about through the resignation of Miss Geraldine Noakes.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE : Mr. Eugene F. Robb, County Treasurer, met with the Commissioners seeking leave to attend the National Guard Encampment to run June 5th through June 18th. He also inquired with regard to the possibility of obtaining an additional leave for a two weeks period from July 7th, to July 21st, to accompany a segment of the Guard to Alaska. The first request was approved, but the second was taken under advisement.

CIVIL DEFENSE MATTERS : Mr. H. E. Christensen, Civil Defense Director for Iron County, reported to the Board that he had an offer of \$150.00 from Mr. Adrian Baldwin for a Jeep which had been pretty well stripped, and recommended to them that the said Offer be accepted as Salvage. The recommendation was approved by the Commissioners.

TRIP FOR TRAILER : Mr. J. A. Pace, County Road Supervisor, requested and obtained permission to go to Provo, Utah, to pickup a heavy Trailer available through the Utah State Forestry and Fire Control Department.

POLICE SCHOOL : Sheriff Otto Fife, requested permission from the Commissioners to send Deputy Sheriff, Hyatt Bentley to a Police School being conducted at Camp Williams. The Board approved the request as well as the expenditure of \$73.20 to cover Lodging and Tuition.

ASSESSED VALUATION : A motion was approved which was made by Commissioner Matheson and seconded by Commissioner Day, authorizing the County Treasurer to adjust the Assessed Valuation for the year of 1963 on property under Serial Number E-1094-3, from \$1,050.00 to \$232.00. This was the adjustment of an error in listing.

BERYL FIRE HOUSE : Assessor H. Dee White, was directed to check the Fire House at Beryl and determine what action would be necessary to complete the Roof. This to place the Commissioners in a better position to adopt proper procedure in getting the work done.

INSURANCE : Glen Froyd and Allen Froyd of the General Acceptance Insurance Agency, spent a considerable length of time discussing the County Insurance program with the Commissioners, especially the problems and possibilities presented by the Repeal of the State Immunity Law, effective July 1st, 1966. Mr. Froyd requested authorization to proceed with a study of the whole Liability Insurance program of the County, but no definite action was taken on the matter by the Board.

JUNKET : Commissioner Ivan M. Matheson, received authorization to attend a meeting in Salt Lake City April 27th, dealing with the proposed reorganization of State Government as proposed by the Little Hoover Commission.

After the bills against the County were either approved or rejected, the Meeting was adjourned.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

TAX MATTER : Through motion of Commissioner Norman H. Day, which was seconded by Commissioner Ivan M. Matheson, with all Commissioners voting in favor thereof; application of Melva Barton, Paragonah, Utah, for waiver of penalty and interest levied in connection with delinquent taxes on property identified by Serial Numbers C281-283, C422 and 421-1 etal; was approved.

QUIT CLAIM DEED : A motion was duly passed which was made by Commissioner Ivan M. Matheson and seconded by Commissioner Day authorizing the issuance of a Quit Claim Deed from the County to Party or Parties designated by the applicant, Mr. Elwood Corry, covering the following described property:

Beg. 107 Feet East from the NW Cor., of Lot 13,
 Block 26, Plat "B" Cedar City, East 91 Feet, South

COAL CREEK WATERSHED : Commissioner Matheson reported that the State Department of Agriculture and the State Soil Conservation Committee have now approved the County's application for authorization to enlarge the Coal Creek Watershed. Wherefore he recommended that the County move forward with its plan to organize and establish a Conservancy District. The recommendation was accepted and approved.

PARAGONAH WATER CONSERVATION PROGRAM: The Commissioners went on record as favoring and supporting the proposed Water Storage and Conservation program at Paragonah, Utah, as now outlined.

RESIGNATION : The Board received a letter from Mrs. Mary Lou Melling of Cedar City, containing her formal resignation from the position which she has held as Secretary of the Iron County Public Health Department. The resignation was accepted coupled with an expression from the Commissioners of their appreciation of her services.

CEDAR CITY LIBRARY : A motion was duly passed which was made by Commissioner Day and seconded by Commissioner Matheson, providing that Iron County pay to Cedar City the sum of \$100.00 to be used by their Library Board to assist them in providing screens for their ground level windows at the Library.

STOCK DRIVES: Commissioner Day stated that due to fencing, B. L. M. Seeding programs, Interstate Highway construction etc, old trails over which Livestock have been moved from Winter Range to Summer Range and viceversa, are being disrupted and in some instances alternate routes are having to be found. As a direct result of this, he had been contacted by a property owner requesting assistance from the County in improving his fence sufficiently to prevent the trespassing of passing herds upon his property, and he therefore felt that the County should, in acting upon this request, formulate a policy with respect to the fencing of livestock driveways by or across private lands. After considerable discussion with respect to the problem and assurance from the County Attorney that the same legal rules apply to Livestock rights of way as do to Roads, the Commission concluded to apply the same rule as is now in force for Road Right Of Ways, namely, where the right of way is already established the property owner bears the responsibility of fencing, but in instances where a new right of way is obtained the County will fence in lieu of land for the right of way.

FIRE HOUSE : The County Assessor reported that he had made an examination of the Fire House at Beryl, as per a previous assignment, and in his opinion the completion of the roof would neither be complicated or expensive. Based on the information obtained from Mr. White, the Commission concluded that it would not be a project required to be bid, and therefore recommended that Mr. Willard Thomson be requested to supply an estimate as to what he would do the job for and if found to be reasonable, he be asked to proceede with the work.

SUBDIVISION : Mr. James Sandberg met with the Board to present a Plat of a Subdivision to be known as "Mountain View Ranchetts" located in and being a part of Section 7, Township 34 South, Range 9 West, SLB&M, for their approval. A motion was duly passed which was made by Commissioner Ivan M. Matheson and Seconded by Norman H. Day granting the said request.

ROADS : Mr. Jess Pickett called on the Commissioners relative to matter of needed additional improvements on the Parowan to Parowan Gap Road. The Commission explained to Mr. Pickett that they were ready to proceede in the very near future with a Crushed Gravel cap on the road, and with oiling just as soon FAS funds were available which did not appear to be prior to the 1967-68 Fiscal Year.

INSURANCE : A Committee of Insurance Agents consisting of Glen Froyd, Allen Froyd and Elwood Corry, met with the Board relative to the insurance program of the County and in connection therewith, to report that the Agents of the County were in the process of forming an Association through which Public Bodies might handle their Insurance Programs. Furthermore, they requested that the Commissioners take the following action:

(1) Until such time as the proposed Association is organized and functioning, the Dixie Leavitt Insurance Agency be restricted from writing further Insurance.

(2) Require Dixie Leavitt make an accounting.

(3) Tie all Liability Insurance into one Policy.

The Commissioners explained to them that they, the Commissioners, did not wish to be placed in the position of being arbitrators of differences that exist among Insurance Agents, and that the matter of consolidating all Liability Insurance under one Policy would most likely be resolved through the specifications in connection with the call for bids as required by law.

No further formal action was taken in the matter.

Minutes of Board of Equalization Meeting held in the City and County Building at Cedar City, Utah, May 31st, 1966, commencing at the hour of 10 A. M.

The following items were presented to the Board for consideration and their action in connection with each matter was as indicated:

(1) Miss Mamie Eck, supervisor of the Iron County Welfare Department, presented a list of those persons whom the Department felt should receive the Indigent Abatement of \$10.00 as a credit against their general property taxes for the year of 1966. The Board concluded to table the said list for further consideration at their June Meeting.

(2) Henry Clayton, Laretta and Carlyle Perry, protested the increase in valuation for the year of 1966 of property described under Serial Number B-292 to \$820.00 from a listing of \$120.00 in 1965. After the County Assessor had explained this to have been the result of an error in posting, the Board ordered the Assessment reduced to \$120.00 and a corrected notice mailed.

(3) Charles F. & Evelyn Brazier protested the raise in assessed value of property described under Serial Number B-190 from \$1,655.00 in 1965 to \$2,430.00 in 1966 as pertaining to the Buildings. After all factors had been considered, the Board directed that the 1966 valuation on Buildings be reduced to \$1,730.00.

(4) Grace McEown objected to a raise in the assessed valuation of Buildings located on property described under Serial Number B-184 from \$1,160.00 in 1965 to \$1,310.00 in 1966. After due deliberation, this item was reduced to \$1,210.00.

(5) Junius F. Williams called the Boards attention to the fact that he had been assessed with a Horse in connection with his property listed under Serial Number A-705-1, and he did in fact own no Horse. The Board therefore directed that this item having an assessed value of \$30.00 be deleted from Mr. Williams assessment.

(6) The Board, feeling the complaint of the Bonneville Investment Company to be a justifiable one, ordered the 1966 assessed valuation as placed on property described under Serial Number C-135, reduced to \$960.00, or the 1965 level.

(7) Sterling R. Bossard met with the Board to review the trend in the assessed valuation on his property, as described under Serial Number B-1127-3, over the past three year period. He noted that the 1964 Valuation was \$2,100.00, the 1965 \$2,135.00 and the 1966 \$2,265.00. While considerable discussion was had relative to the matter, no relief was given.

(8) Wendell P. and Constance B. Miller Stewart complained that they were assessed with Well rights in connection with land described under Serial Number D-540, whereas they had none. They requested that said rights be removed from their assessment and the Board so ordered.

(9) James K. Wadsworth protested the increase in the assessed value of his property as listed under Serial Number A-356. The County Assessor explained that the increase became necessary to equalize Mr. Wadsworth's Real Estate with surrounding property. No relief was therefore given.

Minutes of meetings held May 9th, and 31st, were read and approved.

APPLICATION TOPURCHASE

: Mr. Clifton Taylor of Parowan, Utah, appeared before the Board and made application to purchase a small tract of land situated between the County Road Right-Of-Way and his holdings in the $W\frac{1}{2}NW\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 14, Township 34 South, Range 9 West, S.L.B. & M.. The Commissioners assured Mr. Taylor that they would be happy to authorize sale of the tract to him if they found that they did in fact own it, and that appropriate action would be taken after the question of ownership has been resolved.

TERMINATION OFEMPLOYMENT

: A letter written to Commissioner Ivan M. Matheson by Miss LaRue Ford resigning her position with the County as a PHN, was presented to the Board for its consideration. After due deliberation and in conformity with the wishes of Miss Ford, the resignation was accepted effective June 20th, 1966, together with a vote of thanks from the Commissioners for her efficient service to the Iron County Public Health Department.

TELEVISIONPOWER LINES

: It was reported to the Commissioners that Utah Power and Light Company was now willing and ready to take over and maintain the Power Lines running from their Trunk System to the Television Translators at Beaver Ridge and the Minersville sites, if Iron County wished them to do so. Commissioner Matheson made a motion, that in the interest of better Power service and a savings in cost and responsibility to the County, such action as is necessary to complete the transfer be taken. This motion received a second from Commissioner Day and all members voted in favor thereof.

CIVIL DEFENSE : Mr. H. E. Christensen, Civil Defense Director, met with the Board concerning the possibility of placing the New Civil Defense Warehouse Building on a Lot within the City area rather than on the County Road Yard property north of the City as heretofore planned. He requested and received authorization to work with Cedar City Corporation to determine as to whether or not they owned suitable land which could be obtained for this purpose, and if not to proceed with the original plan. Responding to a further request from Mr. Christensen, a motion was duly passed which was made by Commissioner Matheson and seconded by Commissioner Day authorizing the purchase of a Typewriter at a cost of about \$202.00 for the Civil Defense Department.

EMPLOYMENT : Mr. Garth Gilger appeared before the Commissioners to make application for employment with the County. He was advised by the Board that they were unaware of any opportunities as of the present time.

FIRE DEPARTMENT : Mayor Ralph S. Orton of Parowan, called on the Board to advise them of the fact that the City Fire Fighting Equipment is getting old and that the possibility of replacement will have to be considered in the very near future. He suggested therefore, that the Commission be giving consideration to the possibility and extent of their willingness to participate.

SEWER RIGHT-OF-WAY : Mayor Orton also inquired into the possibility of obtaining permission from the County for Parowan City to run its Sewer Lines from the City Limits to the treatment plant, along the County Road right-of-way Parowan to Parowan Gap Highway. He was assured by the Commission that the County would be willing to cooperate.

TELEVISION : A letter was received from the Bureau Of Land Management at Fillmore, Utah, requesting permission for the said BLM to use the power source at the Television Site on LeVan Peak in connection with an installation which they plan to make in the same area. The Board expressed themselves as being unopposed to granting of the request provided the matter is first cleared with the University Television Service (KUED), and provided that should any interference occur to County Services as a direct or indirect result of such installation, responsibility for correction shall rest solely with the said Bureau Of Land Management.

ROADS : A petition, signed by some thirty Citizens of the Escalante Valley area, seeking the construction of a Road running north and south connecting Valley, McGarry and Bracken Road with Highway 56, was presented for consideration. Following the discussion which ensued, the Board directed Chairman Smith and Road Supervisor Pace to visit the area and obtain sufficient first hand information to permit arriving at a proper and fair priority rating for the proposed project among those of like nature needed in the County.

FIRE WORKS DISPLAY : Chairman Smith reported that he had received a letter from the Cedar City Lions Club requesting financial assistance from the County in connection with their programmed Fire Works Display July 4th, 1966, at Cedar City. The problem of available properly budgeted funds was discussed somewhat, but no definite action was taken.

LIABILITY INSURANCE BIDS : As set forth in the call, at the hour of 2 P. M. the Bid opening for County Liability Insurance Coverage took place.

The following bids were received, opened and read aloud:

(1) That of Pacific Indemnity Group, by and through its Agent, Glen Froyd of Cedar City, Utah, which offered the following:

- (a) Coverage as set forth in specifications \$4,111.00
- (b) Broad Form Optional additional coverage as set forth by covering letter \$4,356.00.

INSURANCE
CONTINUED

: Tom Leavitt and Allen Froyd took the opportunity to apprise the Commissioners of the fact that the Insurance Agents of the County had formed an Association through which they plan to better serve the Public entities in connection with their Insurance needs. Furthermore, that they hoped to foster the Public good by placing all portions of premiums accruing to member agents from Governmental Business, at the disposal of the Association to be expended in furthering Civic projects of general Public Interest, with exception of cost of servicing Policy.

: At the request of County Attorney, Robert L. Gardner, a motion was duly passed which was made by Commissioner Norman H. Day and seconded by Commissioner Ivan M Matheson, authorizing the issuance of a Quit Claim Deed to Cedar City Corporation covering the following described property:

: The Boards attention was called to the fact that the County's Gasoline and Diesel Oil contract has expired, whereupon authorization was given for the County Road Supervisor to call for sealed bids to be presented for consideration at the regular July meeting.

TAX MATTER

: County Treasurer, Eugene F. Robb was authorized to cancell all interest accrued since December 30th, 1964, on delinquent Taxes outstanding against property described under Serial number D572-2, for the reason that the Taxpayer made every effort to pay the outstanding delinquencies as of the aforementioned date but due to an oversight on the part of the Treasurer he was deprived of so doing.

EQUALIZATION : The following matters came before the Commissioners for their consideration while functioning in the capacity of a County Board Of Equalization:

(1) Willard Jones of Enoch, met with the Board inquiring as to whether or not he is now being assessed with and therefore paying taxes on acreage covered by a wash which runs through his property. He was advised that without doubt, he was being assessed with the area, but that the waste factor would be considered in arriving at the total value for the tract.

(2) Mrs. Priscilla Skougard of Parowan, complained to the Board that her City real estate had been increased from a valuation of \$30.00 in the year of 1965 to \$100.00 in 1966 and that she desired to know the justification therefor. The County Assessor explained that, as it stood, this item was listed below other property of like nature in the vicinity and an increase was therefore necessary as an equalization measure.

(3) Mr. Ivan Decker of Las Vegas, Nevada, objected to an assessment for the year of 1966 of \$100.00 on one acre of unimproved real estate located in the mouth of Parowan Canyon. After study of the matter, the Board ordered the valuation reduced to \$50.00.

(4) Mrs. Ruth Rosenberg of Cedar City, appeared before the Board for the purpose of protesting the Assessed Valuation placed on her residence listed under Serial Number B822-1. After discussing the matter with her, the Commission concluded that, based on information at hand, the Valuation was pretty much in line with Tax Commission policy. Never-the-less, the Assessor was instructed to look into the matter and Mrs Rosenberg was advised that she could exercise her right of appeal if conclusions were not to her satisfaction.

(5) Smoot Seaman of Cedar City, requested a reexamination and appraisal of what he referred to as the old Family Residence, listed under Serial Number B563-1. He reported that it was not in use and had in fact deteriorated to the point that it was not worth the necessary cost to repair. The Assessor was directed to make the examination and submit his recommendation.

EQUALIZATION

: (6) E. Scott and Kareen P. Chamberlain, requested that the assessment for one Cow in the sum of \$36.00 and one Horse in the amount of \$50.00, be removed from their listing under Serial Number D482-1 for the reason that they own no personal property of this nature. The Board, after being advised by the County Assessor that this was in fact an erroneous listing, ordered the correction made.

(7) Osmer K. Neilson of Parowan, protested the assessment of property listed under Serial Number A145-1, on the grounds that his per front foot rate was higher than adjoining property. The County Assessor took the position that the valuation was equitable in as much as this was a corner Lot fronting on both Main and Center, whereas comparable listings have less favorable position. Based on this information, no relief was granted on this item.

(8) Mr. William H. Wood of Cedar City, protested the 1966 valuation placed on property described under Serial Number E1195-1 on the grounds that it had been listed as having the benefit of Water Rights, whereas it did in fact have none. It appearing to the Board that the representation was correct, they ordered the assessment for the said year reduced from \$1,280.00 to \$320.00.

(9) Ray Thomas Enterprises of Las Vegas, Nevada, objected to property described under Serial Number E1594-1, being listed together with Well Rights whereas no such rights now exist. Upon being advised by County Assessor, H. Dee White, that it was his understanding these rights had now been transferred, the Board directed that the assessed valuation of this tract be reduced from \$2,180.00 to \$1,280.00.

In summation of all previous action taken relative to the Business of Equalization for the year of 1966, and in the nature of approval of other matters of Equalization for the said year not heretofore listed, the Board passed a motion duly made by Commissioner Day and seconded by Commissioner Matheson approving the following itemized Decreases and Increases in Assessed Valuation, as well as the subsequent list of Abatements and Veterans Exemptions:

ROAD MATTER : Mr. Clinton Bowler of Enterprise met with the Board seeking assistance from the County in constructing approximately one half mile of dead end road between Sections Twenty and Twentynine, Township Thirty Six South, Range Sixteen West, SLB&M; for the use and benefit of some five Farmers of the area. Mr. Bowler explained that so far they had been unable to obtain sufficient land to provide the standard width right of way required by the County, but was hopeful that the Commissioners would be willing to make an exception in this case and contribute assistance regardless of this fact.

The Board explained that there were two problems associated with this proposal that would have to be resolved before they could authorize County participation. One would be that of a standard width right of way first being obtained, and the other that of the project having many of the characteristics of a private road. Thereupon, the matter was tabled for further consideration.

Chairman Smith reported that he and Mr. J. A. Pace, County Road Supervisor, had investigated the request of residents of the Richland area for a Road connecting Highway 56 with Valley and McGarry and Bracken Roads. As a result of their findings they recommended that, pending time when traffic will more nearly justify the project requested, a road be built through the property of Dr. Ben Thompson, if right of way can be obtained, connecting the two existing East and West paralleling County Road of the Area. In their opinion this, as a temporary measure, would modify the problem of the Citizens concerned. The recommendation was accepted and approved.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

STREET

IMPROVEMENT: A delegation from Summit consisting of Frank Dalley, Delos Dalton and Alma Lawrence, met with the Board for the purpose of requesting assistance from the County in the nature of Street improvement for their Community. They specifically requested that First South, running West from first West be graded and graveled, and that First South running East from First West to First East, and First East Streets be Oiled. They also requested assistance in preparing a suitable parking area at their Cemetery.

The Commissioners assured them that as soon as necessary Equipment could be made available, the projects of grading and graveling, and the work on the parking area would be done. However, the Oiling project could not be undertaken until next year.

CIVIL DEFENSE: Mr. Haldow E. Christensen, Civil Defense Director, met with the Commissioners seeking authority to either repair a Civil Defense Jeep which he has on hand or to issue it to the Iron County Sheriffs Jeep Posse and let them repair it. After due deliberation, the Board directed Mr. Christensen to have the repairs made and hold the Vehicle for special issue for specific County purposes only.

PROPERTY ACCESS: Mr. Henry Mackelprang of Cedar City, advised the Board that Interstate Highway 15, was isolating a tract of his land and that for this reason, he was interested in purchasing a small tract in the area which he understood the County to own which might serve as an approach to his property. The Commissioners explained to Mr. Mackelprang that there

were others in the same area with the same problem and that in fairness none should be left with out access. They suggested therefore, that an effort first be made to obtain assurance from the State Road Commission that a means of ingress and egress will be provided for all property owners in need of such provision.

ROAD MATTERS : Commissioners Howard Pryor and Eugene H. Mayers of Beaver County discussed with the Board the possibility of working out a program of exchanging maintenance on County Border Line Road to the possible benefit and advantage of both Beaver and Iron Counties. Furthermore, they were of the opinion that under the practice now being followed, many Roads which are now being maintained by the County other than that in which the Road is located, are not being listed for Class "B" mileage, a situation which could be corrected by and through better cooperation in this area. The Commissioners of Iron County expressed themselves as feeling that the proposal had merit, and as being willing to join with Beaver County in working out an agreeable program. Thereupon the Beaver County Commissioners requested that the matter be delayed as to further discussion until the third member of their Board arrived. This was agreed upon with no further consideration being given the proposal at this meeting.

Commissioner Matheson reported that Garbage Dump areas had now been designated and approved for use of the unincorporated Towns, and there now existed the problem of constructing and maintaining Roads into each location. Following a discussion of the matter, the Board concluded to assume this responsibility, for and on behalf of the County.

CAPITAL EXHIBIT: Chairman Smith reported that the Five County Organizations Executive Committee had, at their last meeting, discussed the problem of financing the display for the organization at the State Capitol, and had concluded that each Committee Member should first discuss and obtain recommendations from his own County Board before taking definite action. Whereupon the matter was discussed and while no definite action was taken, it was concluded that some formula at arriving at each Counties share should be adopted that would more nearly express benefits to be obtained from the display than the one now used in arriving at the annual operating assessment. Under the assumption that display space accorded each County would be about equal, some thought was given to the idea that, with the possible exception of Beaver County, the total cost of approximately \$6,500.00 should be shared equally.

LAND FOR MUSEUM : At their regular July meeting, the Board Of County Commissioners authorized the issuance of a long term lease to the Cedar City Chamber Of Commerce covering certain property owned by Iron County and located immediately West of Highway 91 and North of Coal Creek, to be used as a site for a Museum. The Chamber Of Commerce now inform the Commissioners that they intend, as soon as the Museum is established, to deed the property to the State of Utah and they therefore need title. The Commissioners expressed their willingness to issue Quit Claim Deed to the property as soon as it becomes evident that the project will materialize.

TELEVISION : Mr. Elvin Webster, Serviceman for County Television Equipment, inquired as to what the Board wished to do with Wire previously purchased to extend the Power Lines at the Minersville Television Site, and which wire is not now needed since Utah Power and Light Company has assumed this responsibility. The Commissioners concluded to hold it for use as needed in other sectors.

QUIT CLAIM DEED : A motion was duly passed which was made by Commissioner Matheson and seconded by Commissioner Day, authorizing the issuance of a Quit Claim Deed to Cedar Stake Of The Church Of Jesus Christ Of Latter-Day Saints covering the following described property:

NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 17, West 40 Acres of Lot 4, Section 31, Township 33 South, Range 15 West, SLB&M, Also Lot 3, Sahara Subdivision.

MEETINGS : Commissioner Norman H. Day was authorized to attend a meeting at Park City, August 24th, 1966, and the County Clerk and Assessor were authorized to attend the Clerks and Assessors Convention being held at Panguitch, Utah, August 10th, 11th, and 12th.

LIABILITY INSURANCE : Mr. Glen Froyd of the Glen Froyd Insurance Agency of Cedar City, by telephone, recommended that the Commissioners contact the Moreton General Agency of Salt Lake City, and advise them that seventy five percent of the Agents concerned with the recent Contract of Insurance made with Iron County, favored the Glen Froyd Agency servicing both the County and County Hospital Contracts and splitting the Premium on a sixty forty basis, with all payments of Premiums being made to the aforementioned Glen Froyd Agency. Furthermore, that if they, the Moreton General Agency were not willing to approve this arrangement, the County would Cancel out and award their Contract to the next low bidder. After the request had been considered

by the Board, they ruled that in their opinion, no further action was necessary on their part.

JUDGES OF

ELECTIONS: At this point the Commissioners proceeded with the business of appointing Election Judges for the September 13th, Primary Election. PARKING LOT: Mr. Jay Moore and Howard Rasmussen were authorized to proceed with the construction of the retaining walls north of the Court-house preparatory to the establishment of a parking Lot. Under the agreement they are to construct two walls one hundred thirty feet in length, six inches in width, and twelve inches in height together with a six by twelve inch footing. Said walls and footings to be reinforced with three eights inch steel with ties at each two foot interval. Total cost of the project estimated to not exceed four hundred sixty dollars.

MICROFILMING: Joan Wasden, County Recorder, met with the Board seeking recommendations from them as to price and policy she should adopt in dealing with the Valley View Medical Center in connection with a proposal that she Microfilm their X-Rays for them. The Commissioners suggested that the matter be tabled until after their next Hospital Board Meeting.

CONVENTION : In response to a request from Mrs. Wasden, a motion was duly passed which was made by Commissioner Day and Seconded by Commissioner Smith, authorizing her to attend the summer Convention of County Recorders at Ogden, Utah, September 15th, & 16th.

ROADS : Mr. Clark Elmer of the Utah State Road Commission met with the Board regarding Road Matters. Among matters of general interest, he specifically suggested that a letter be written to the State Road Commission naming the Roads which run over the County line into Beaver County and which Roads Iron County maintains, in order that they may be listed for Class "B" funds. He advised that Beaver County had already listed the roads running over the County Line into Iron County and which Roads they maintain.

CIVIL DEFENSE : Mr. H. E. Christensen, Iron County Civil Defense Director, met with the Commissioners to make his monthly report and to advise the Commissioners of a Civil Defense meeting to be held in the City and County Building at Cedar City at 1 P. At the said meeting the proposal to build an emergency operating center at the State Road Commission Headquarters in Cedar City will be considered, and the extent to which Iron County will be expected to participate arrived at.

FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT : Mayor Ralph S. Orton and Councilman Morris Rassmussen, met with the Commissioners to advise them that Parowan City's Fire Fighting Equipment had completely failed and that they had accepted bid for a New Truck at a total cost of \$21,528.00 less trade in allowance on old unit of \$1,500.00. Furthermore, that in as much as this Equipment is used both as a City Unit and for runs out into the unincorporated areas, they felt that the County should share the cost with them on a fifty fifty basis. WEED SPRAYING EQUIPMENT : Mr. Wallace Sjoblom, County Agent, requested permission from the County Commissioners to order New Spraying Equipment for the County Noxious Weed program now in order to assure delivery in time for the 1967 season. The Board expressed themselves as having no objection to Mr. Sjoblom placing the order now if in his opinion it was adviseable, but they saw no reason why it would not be delivered in ample time if ordered later.

COMMISSIONERS DAY AT U. S. U : Mr. Sjoblom advised the Commissioners that they and their wives were invited to attend Commissioners Day at Utah State University October 15th, 1966. Reservations to be made by October 4th. The matter was discussed, but no definate action was taken.

BUILDING INSPECTOR : The question of the appointment of a Building Inspector and or appraiser to function in connection with services of this nature required in maintaining Fire Insurance Coverage on County Buildings, came up for consideration. The name of Charles Brazier had been suggested to the Board, and in as much they understood that he was already engaged in this sort of work, Commissioner Day made a motion to the effect that he be appointed to serve a one year term beginning with November 1st, 1966, provided an agreement could be reached and an understanding had with respect to the matter of fees. The Motion provided further, that the investment be in Depository Certificates.

BERYL FIRE HOUSE : Chairman Smith reported that he had checked the needs at the Fire House at Beryl and had asked Mr. George F. Beacham at New Castle to submit a bid on completion of the work. Furthermore, he suggested that in the event the bid of Mr. Beacham appears to be reasonable that he be authorized to procede with the work. The recommendation was approved.

TAX MATTER : County Treasurer, Eugene F. Robb, reported that there had been water rights assessed in connection with property owned by Basil Gilger for the years of 1963 and 1964 the tax which he had refused to pay for the reason that he did not own the Water. In order to clear the record, Mr. Robb requested authorization to cancel these assessments as Double, Illegal and Erroneous in as much as this is what they appear to be. FAIR GROUNDS IMPROVEMENT : Mayor Ralph S. Orton of Parowan City met with the Commissioners to determine as to whether or not they would be willing to cooperate in further improvement of the Rail at the Race Track. The Board explained that some of the money budgeted for this purpose was as of now unexpended, but they felt that Parowan City should first determine what in their opinion was first in importance, finishing of the rail or that of purchasing the Richarson property, which they understand to now be available, for additional parking space. Should the City conclude to purchase the additional land area, the County would participate on a fifty fifty basis to extent of budgeted funds available, or in case their decision be to finish the rails first, the County would participate to extent of funds remaining which were appropriated for this purpose. Further action therefore to await a determination by Parowan City.

BEE INSPECTOR: The Commissioners were contacted by Bee owners of the County requesting that an Inspector be appointed. They explained that they wished to move their Bees to the State of California for the Winter, and that they would be unable to enter the said State without an inspection Certificate. The Board concluded to see if the Bee Inspector from Washington County could be obtained to care for this particular matter.

CEDAR FIRE

DEPARTMENT: A committee from the Cedar City Fire Department consisting of

Chief Orwin Green, David Bentley and Jerry L. Eyman, met with the Board requesting financial assistance from the County in obtaining new hats and coats for their members. They stated that Cedar City had agreed to cooperate in the program and if the County could see fit to contribute the sum of \$448.00 all members could be outfitted. After due deliberation, a motion was passed which was made by Commissioner Ivan M. Matheson and seconded by Commissioner Norman H. Day granting the request.

FAIR

BOARD: A financial report was received from the County Fair Board for the year of 1966, which was examined and approved.

PARKING LOT

FAIR GROUNDS: Morris Rasmussen, Parowan City Councilman, reported to the Commissioners that the City had concluded to purchase the land belonging to Frank Richardson as additional parking area for the City Race Track and Fair Grounds, a project in which the Board had previously indicated they would participate. A motion was duly passed which was made by Commissioner Day and seconded by Commissioner Matheson, pledging the County to one-half the cost of said land, provided said sum did not exceed \$500.00.

BID

OPENING: At 10 A.M. as scheduled in the call, bids were opened and read aloud, which were received in response to the County's invitation to dealers to bid on a truck for the County Road Department. All bids were found to meet specifications of letter and were as follows:

On passage of a motion which was made by Commissioner Day and seconded by Commissioner Smith, the low bid was accepted.

CIVIL

DEFENSE: Mr. H. E. Christensen, Iron County Civil Defense Director, met with the Board to report on activities of his department. He explained that all teaching of Civil Defense personnel was now being handled through the Utah State University and that he had been asked by some of the teachers to permit them to take out Iron County Civil Defense Equipment and materials for use in instruction. He stated further that in his opinion this should not be done and requested an expression from the Commission as to their wishes in the matter. Following a discussion of the matter, the Board voted to support him in his views and not authorize the use of these materials as teaching aids.

JEEP POSSE : Iron County Sheriff, Otto Fife, asked the Commissioners to include in the Sheriffs Budget for the year 1967 the sum of \$300.00 to \$500.00 to be used to assist the Jeep Posse in obtaining equipment and other materials needed by them in their activities. This matter was taken under advisement.

CHAMBER OF
COMMERCE:

A committee from the Cedar City Chamber of Commerce consisting of President Therol McArthur, Milt Jolley, Tom Brown and Keith Cripps, called on the Board relative to matters associated with the resignation of Mr. Milt Jolley as Secretary of the Cedar City Chamber of Commerce and Publicity Director for Iron County. Considerable discussion was had regarding procedure in obtaining a replacement and other related matters of mutual interest. It was agreed that the Chamber should obtain such applications as they desired

and then call for a representation from the Board of Commissioners to meet with them at the time the said applications are to be considered.

SKI RUN: Mr. Gail Adams, member of group operating ski run at the Woods Ranch Recreation Area, met with the Commission seeking their assistance in obtaining assistance from the State Road Commission in clearing snow from the parking area at their ski location. He was assured by the commission that they would be happy to make such a contribution if they would not by so doing assume any legal responsibility or liability. This matter to be cleared with the County Legal Department.
