## REGULAR JANUARY 12th, 1977, MEETING

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Board of Iron County Commissioners, held in Commission Chambers at the Courthouse, Parowan, Utah, January 12th, 1977, beginning at the hour of 9 A. M.

Officers in attendance were:

H. Grant Seaman, Commission Chairman Cleo Wood, Commissioner James L. Clark, Commissioner (Excused) Hans Q. Chamberlain, Attorney Clair Hulet, Clerk

Prayer was offered by Chairman, H. Grant Seaman.

Minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

J. P. COURT MATTER: Mr. D. Christian Ronnow, City Judge, and Judge Pro-tem of the Cedar City Precinct Court, met the Commissioners for the purpose of explaining that in order for him to be effective in handling, on a temporary basis, both positions, he needed more than part time services from the secretary of the Precinct Court, and requested that the Board arrange for and approve funding to cover costs for the additional time.

Following a brief discussion, the Commissioners approved the request for additional secretarial time, and compensation for additional hours served at same hourly pay scale as now being paid for her services.

BUSES-AGING COUNCIL: Through, Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, Mrs. Yuk Jun Joseph,

advised the Board that certain surplus buses were available for purchase, and through Title 20 money, funds could be obtained for their purchase. Wherefore, she requested that the Commissioners authorize the purchase of one or more of these vehicles to be used in connection with the County Aging Program.

The request and proposal was briefly discussed and tabled.

Mr. Rulon S. Woodbury, County Chairman of the Aging Council, requested and received approval of the appointment of Mr. Benson Haycock, as a member of the Council to replace Mr. Boyd Mitchell who had submitted his resignation.

ambulance service business in Iron County. The matter was discussed at length, and tabled for study and consideration.

AND PLANNING: Mr. Floyd Rigby, of Cedar City, appeared for the purpose of bringing to the attention of the Board of County Commissioners certain problems related to the County Planning Program, and suggested solutions.

Among the principal problems related was the delay and time loss to citizens caused by the number of meetings called at which a quorum of Commission members was not present. He suggested that either the number of Commission members be increased, alternate members be appointed, or more diligence be demanded of present members. Hal S. Mitchell, Chairman of the Planning Commission, subsequently appeared making a very similar presentation.

Whereupon, the Commissioners gave assurance of their willingness to cooperate in any logical effort to find a solution to the attendance problem, including the giving of such weight to suggestions offered as, in their judgment, they are entitled.

In addition, Mr. Mitchell requested that certain changes be made in the new Subdivision Ordinance to make it compatable with the Zoning Ordinance, and certain changes be made in the Subdivision Ordinance itself to make it conform to the Ordinance as approved and agreed upon.

Among these was the family provision omitted in the publishing, and clarification of matters related to small subdivisions.

Mr. Mitchell was advised to provide the County

Attorney with a list of corrections necessary, and he would prepare them for corrective publication.

Furthermore, Chairman Mitchell, advised that they need a means of on sight inspection for proposed subdivisions, and recommended that Ray Anker be so assigned.

On motion of Commissioner, Cleo Wood, duly seconded by Commissioner, H. Grant Seaman, and with all Commissioners voting in the affirmative, the request was granted. Inspection to take place immediately upon presentation of preliminary plat.

Mr. Mitchell also suggested that some sort of directive be prepared to advise Commission members of their duties which he felt would help to alleviate the attendance problem at Planning & Zoning meetings. This suggestion to be studied.

Mr. Rigby presented a linen plat of a segment of his subdivision in section 32, township 32 South, range 18 West, SLB&M, here-

tofore conditionally approved, and upon the Board being assured that the then existing deficiency had been corrected, the certificate of approval was executed for and on behalf of Iron County by Chairman, H. Grant Seaman.

for the purpose of claiming inconsistence in the valuation of buildings in his immediate area. His presentation was heard and upon its completion, he was advised that a review was contemplated, and if inconsistencies were in fact found, necessary adjustments would be made. He stated that his valuation was fair, but for consistency to exist either his home should be reduced in value or his neighbors increased.

EDY SCOUTS: Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, reported to the Commission that he had recently attended a meeting of the District

Boy Scout Council, and had learned that Western Rock Products Company had made a \$10,000.00 contribution to the Thunder Ridge Camp. \$5,000.00 in cash and \$5,000.00 in equipment services. He also stated that his membership on the Council had been approved and accepted.

DEPUTY

COUNTY ATTORNEY: County Attorney, Hans Q. Chamberlain, advised the Commissioners that he had selected a Deputy County Attorney and presented for their acceptance and approval the name of Robert Braithwaite. Following a brief discussion, a motion was duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and seconded by Commissioner, H. Grant Seaman approving the appointee. Mr. Braithwaite subsequently took and executed his Oath of Office before Joan Wasden, County Recorder.

BRIAN HEAD MATTERS: A delegation from Brian Head City, with Rex Emenegger and Don VanSickle as spokesmen appeared and presented a number of items for the Board's consideration.

First was that of an outstanding obligation due and owing to the Engineering Firm of Bush and Gudgel for engineering services rendered in connection with a proposed project to convey sewage from Brian Head into the Parowan City sewer system via Parowan canyon. The project and the assignment apparently having been instigated by the trustees of the Special Improvement District.

Don VanSickle, acting as spokesman on this particular item, contended that the claim for services by Bush and Gudgel was in fact a direct claim against Iron County, and that the Board of Iron County Commissioners, in a regular meeting of late spring or early summer of 1976, had unanamously ac-

knowledged, and accepted the responsibility for it, and agreed to provide means for its liquidation.

The Commissioners denied any such acknowledgment or action, and an examination of the minutes, for period designated, supported their position.

The County Attorney also advised that legal proceedural requirements for dealing with such a matter would have precluded the Commission from taking action compatable with that contended to have been taken by Don VanSickle.

Mr. Emenegger explained that a solution was what was sought, not a controversy.

Wherefore, it was recommended that the officials of the Special Improvement District arrange for their Attorney to meet with the County Attorney in an effort to clarify some of the legal obstacles, and formulate a plan to properly liquidate the obligation.

The second item called on for consideration, was the question of the Brian Head area being omitted from the special service area for garbage disposal.

It was suggested that probably an appropriate solution could best be found for this item through a meeting of Brian Head Officials and their Attorney, D. & O. Sanitation Officials, and the County Attorney.

The third item advanced was a request by the delegation that the Commissioners take timely and appropriate action to have Iron County designated as a Disaster Area, due to the lack of snow, in order that businesses affected would be eligible for low cost loans. The Board had no objection to the proposal but suggested that a little more basic information was needed, in order for such an action to be timely and appropriate.

GARBAGE SERVICE: Mr. Cressel Sherratt and Mr. Garth Sherratt, appeared to

protest the apparent mandatory payment of garbage pickup and disposal fees for those within the service area, and due to their more or less isolated location, be deprived of the service.

They were advised that D. & O. Sanitation, would be requested to consult with them and make a determination as to whether or not a satisfactory arrangement for service could be provided. They also expressed their opposition to the proposal by the Park Service to make a Wilderness Area out of the Cedar Breaks National Monument.

In connection with the subject of solid waste disposal, a letter was received and considered from the Division of Health, Salt Lake

City, complimenting the Commissioners for their efforts to upgrade solid waste management in Iron County, advising them of action necessary to be taken to comply with State standards, and offering their assistance. Copy of the bulletin enclosed containing an outline of regulations imposed by the Department, was referred to D. & O. Sanitation for study and recommendations for compliance.

COUNTY ROADS

: Mr. Lynn Fiack, County Road Supervisor, presented his

payroll for approval, and conferred with the Board relative to the release of the performance Bond in connection with Phase II, Cottonwood Estates, a Western Rock Contract. Upon Mr. Fiack's assurance that the construction met standards required, the Bond was exonerated.

Mr. Lee Fife, through Commissioner, Cleo Wood, requested that Iron County issue assurance that a certain road or street in the Spanish Trails Estates, would be brought to standards required by financial institutions for the funding of home construction, by April 1st, 1977. The Board concluded that if the subdivider would contract the construction of the project to a reliable contractor and obtain a performance Bond running in favor of Iron County, and extend completion date to July 1st, 1977, they would be willing to issue a letter of assurance.

GARBAGE
SERVICE AREA: Mr. Caudell Orton, representing D. & O. Sanitation, met
the Board relative to the exclusion of Brian Head from
the service area, and was advised that action had already been taken in this
matter.

SALARY HEARING: Time for calling a public hearing on proposed increases in Officials salaries was raised, and a conclusion reached to schedule it for 3 P. M. January 26th, 1977. Department heads to make preliminary presentations of their proposal for Commission consideration prior to the hearing.

PRECINCT JUSTICE: Gordon Adams, Sheriff's Department, and Elroy Mason, and
Roger Bagley of the Highway Patrol met the Commissioners
for the purpose of recommending that Margaret Miller, secretary to the Cedar
City Precinct Justice, be appointed Justice of the Precinct Pro-tem. The
matter was discussed at length and tabled for further consideration.

After bills against the County had either been approved or rejected, the meeting was adjourned.

## REGULAR JANUARY 26th, 1977 MEETING

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Board of Iron County Commissioners, held in Commission Chambers, at the Courthouse, Parowan, Utah, January 26th, 1977, beginning at the hour of 9 A. M.

Officers in attendance were:

H. Grant Seaman, Commission Chairman Cleo Wood, Commissioner James L. Clark, Commissioner Clair Hulet, Clerk Hans Q. Chamberlain, Attorney

Prayer offered by Commissioner Cleo Wood.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved with minor amendments.

EMR. H. Dee White, County Assessor, appeared before the Board seeking authority to accept, without penalty, certain Green Belt applications which were postmarked prior to December 31st, 1976, but not received until after January 1st, 1977. The Commissioners advised Mr. White, that as a standard practice, he should recognize the postmark. The items under consideration were listed under serial numbers D-575-575-3, D-518-1, D-256, C-1156, and E-1763-1766.

Mr. Claron Bradshaw, and Melba Wood, appeared for purpose of requesting that certain property owned by them and related parties, be awarded a Green Belt status for 1976, for the cause and reason that extenuating circumstances prevented a proper and timely application for the said year.

Following a review of the matter, the Commissioners found themselves in favor of granting the request, but since they had no precedent to follow, their approval was conditional upon such an action being compatible with proceedural requirements imposed by the Green Belt Law and Regulations. The property was assessed under serial number DI-515.

Mr. LaMar Jensen, County Treasurer, reported to the Board that certain assessments of personal property listed in Tax Sale Record No. 34, had proven to be uncollectable for the reason that the parties to whom the assessments were made had moved from the area, with whereabouts unknown, and leaving no assets through which a collection could be enforced. Wherefore, in order to clear the record, he sought authorization to cancel.

Accordingly, by motion duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and seconded by Commissioner, James L. Clark, the requested authorization was granted.

AGING COUNCIL MATTER: Mrs. Yuk Jun Joseph, Director of the Aging Council, appeared for the purpose of explaining and verbally supporting her request heretofore presented, for authorization to purchase, through Title 20 funds, buses to be used in connection with their program.

Among other matters, and in addition to her argument in justification, she outlined proposals for supervision, drivers or driver's hours and rate of pay and maintenance, etc. Explaining that she had obtained four bids, the lowest for acceptable equipment being \$9,000.00, per bus, and that the purchase of the equipment and its operation and maintenance would run at an estimated cost of some \$13,327.20 first year. This understood to include cost of driver four days per week at \$2.30 per hour.

A general discussion followed, which included the matter of adequate parking facilities, liability etc. None of these matters were resolved, and the request tabled for further study.

#### APPOINTMENTS

AGING COUNCIL: Attention of the Board was called to the fact that the terms of the following members of the Aging Council had expired and that reappointment was in order.

Accordingly, on motion of Commissioner, James L. Clark, duly seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and with all Commissioners voting in the affirmative, each was reappointed for a three year term.

CUSTODIAN : Mr. Elmer Truman, custodian at the County Courthouse, appeared relative to a number of items.

First, he inquired as to the possibility of obtaining a salary increase. With respect to this item he was advised that a hearing was scheduled at 3 P. M. on this date on the matter of proposed salary increases for all employees, and that an equitable adjustment would be considered for him as a part and parcel of the total package.

Secondly, he explained to the Board that there were a number of tools needed in connection with his employment, which he had personally been providing, and which he felt the County should purchase and place at his disposal. He stated that he believed the purchase could be made through Civil Defense at a very nominal cost. Following a brief discussion, the request was granted. Furthermore, he sought approval from the Commissioners, for the assign-

ment to him for his use in connection with his employment, of a pickup truck by and through the County Civil Defense Department. This was also briefly reviewed with Mr. Truman and approved. It being understood that the pickup truck would come at no cost to the County, and operating expenses for use required would be nominal.

JUSTICE COURT

DEPOSITORY : Mr. Haldow E. Christensen, Cedar City Precinct Justice,

by and through Commissioner, Cleo Wood, requested permission from the Commissioners to install Depository Equipment for use by Peace Officers during Mr. Christensen's off hours, for their convenience in depositing traffic violation bail taken by the Peace Officer from a citizen who did not wish to be detained for appearance during regular office hours. The matter was discussed at length, and since there were some reservations expressed, no firm action was taken although the majority opinion seemed to favor approval.

WOODS RANCH SKATING: The Cedar City Kiwanis Club, through Commissioner, H.

Grant Seaman, reported that they had arranged for and used a truck from the Cedar City Fire Department to spray their Ice Skating Rink at Wood Ranch Recreation Area, and petitioned the County Commissioners to approve payment of the costs from County Recreation funds. After due deliberation, the cost being nominal, the claim was approved as a proper County charge.

Furthermore, it was reported that Mr. Charles Blackburn, had requested and been granted permission to remove picnic tables at the Woods Ranch Recreation Area, from areas where they interfere with winter activities, upon the specific understanding that he would be fully responsible for putting them back in place come spring.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: The Cedar City Fire Department, through Commissioner,

James L. Clark, requested permission to purchase a twoway radio forms small fire truck recently converted for use on runs to small
grass or brush fires. The estimated cost to be in the neighborhood of \$1,200.00.
The matter was tabled for investigation of the cost factor.

from a Mr. and Mrs. Michael Hyatt, for the position of attendants at the Iron County Detention Home, which is presently closed. The matter was discussed and tabled, pending a review with Sheriff, Ira Schoppmann, County Attorney, Hans Q. Chamberlain, and his Honor, Judge Joseph E. Jackson.

ECONOMIC

DISASTER AREA: A delegation from Brian Head, headed by Rex Emenegger, met
the Board to again urge the County Commissioners to take
such steps as may be necessary to have Iron County designated as an economic

disaster area due to lack of snow. The matter was discussed at length resulting in a motion being passed, which was made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, and seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, granting the request, and authorizing the issuance of a letter to the Governor advising him of the action taken.

Mr. Emenegger also requested that Brian Head City be permitted to deal directly with Iron County with respect to solid waste disposal, and that such fees as may be agreed upon be paid to Iron County. Following a brief discussion it was concluded that a meeting of D. & O. Sanitation, the County Attorney, and Mr. Rex Emenegger, would first be advisable to hammer out some of the details and problems that may surface with respect to the proposal.

In connection with the Bush and Gudgel Engineering bill, heretofore considered, Mr. Emenegger reported that the Board of Trustees of the Special Improvement District, were in process of implementing necessary action to place the Commissioners in proper and legal position to impose a tax on property within the District for purpose of liquidating the subject obligation.

County Attorney, Hans Q. Chamberlain, requested that records show that he had examined the Commissioneminutessand found that in no less than four or five different instances, the Trustees or other parties interested in the Brian Head Special Improvement District had appeared before the Board of County Commissioners with Counsel.

AMBULANCE SERVICE: Mr. Reed Embley and wife, again appeared relative to their request for a subsidy of some \$1,800.00 per month from Iron County, as heretofore presented. A number of items were discussed, including qualifications and requirements, cost of equipment operation and maintenance, advantages and disadvantages of a voluntary system, and question of County responsibility.

At this point Mr. Don Barnes appeared and reported that he was in process of setting up a like service and believed he could operate without subsidy.

Some brief discussion then ensued regarding the competitive development, and the matter tabled.

ROADS: A delegation from Monta Vista Subdivision headed by Keith Munford, met the Commissioners, for the purpose of requesting improvement of the road in what is known as Williams Lane. Explaining that the road is too narrow to permit safe passing, and a culvert is not seated properly to permit transporting of water under and across the roadway without backing it up onto Lots located within the vicinity of the culvert.

The Commissioners, along with the Road Supervisor, agreed to make an onsight inspection of the problem in an effort to work out a satisfactory solution.

SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL: The aforesaid delegation also registered protests against the solid waste disposal system now in effect in their area. In substance their grounds for protest were as follows:

- (1) Object to subsidizing private enterprise.
- (2) Object to placement, attention to, and upkeep of containers.
- (3) Justification for fee charged not substantiated.
- (4) Want participation in the program made optional.

Following a discussion at length, and in response to a petition filed, it was concluded to hold an informative type meeting within the service district. Time and place to be announced.

COUNTY FAIR: Mr. Art Walunas, President of the Iron County Fair Board,
appeared for the specific purpose of soliciting more funds
from the County for the County Fair Program. Following a short review, Mr. Walunas submitted written proposals for study. He to appear later for further consultation.

SALARY HEARING: At 3 P. M., as heretofore scheduled, and with due and proper notice thereon given, hearing was held on proposed salary increases for County Officials and employees.

Most Department heads were present, and all persons present who wished to be heard were heard with respect to the proposal. Whereupon, the matter was tabled for further study and consideration.

LAND SURVEY MATTER: Mr. Dean Forsyth of New Castle, called attention of the

Commissioners to the fact that a County Road entering New

Castle Town was not properly located upon the County ownership plats, resulting
in improper assessment for tax purposes of property affected by the Road, probably
all related to erroneous title records. Mr. Forsyth sought the cooperation of Iron

County in solving the problems for reason that a County Road is a contributing

Orcatrleast a related factor.

The Board, after a review of the matter, agreed to participate to the extent of fifty percent of the survey cost which is necessary and possibly the sole requisite to a solution.

A survey necessary in order to obtain right of way deeds from Waldon Isom, John Beal, Bryant Leigh, and the Sherratt Brothers, was also authorized.

SIGN SURVEY: County Road Supervisor, Lynn Fiack, was authorized to proceed with the County Road Sign Survey, and to cooperate fully with the State Department of Transportation in connection with the matter.

LEGISLATION: Mr. Jess Pickett, of Parowan, appeared seeking Commission support for House Bill No. 135 pertaining to the use of irrigation water. After the purpose and objective of the Bill had been explained, a motion was unanimously passed, which was made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, and seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, authorizing the issuance of a letter supporting the measure.

Mr. Pickett also reiterated his claim that farmers should be eliminated from the solid waste disposal program.

## REGULAR FEBRUARY 9th, 1977 MEETING

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Board of Iron County Commissioners, held in Commission Chambers at the Courthouse, Parowan, Utah, February 9th, 1977, beginning at the hour of 9 A. M.

Officers in attendance were:

Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

LETTERS : As the first matter of business, the Board directed that
authorization given by them to County Attorney, Hans Q.
Chamberlain, subsequent to the previous Commission meeting to issue letters to
Reed Embley stating their position on his request for subsidy, and to IHC serv-
ing notice of their intention to terminate contract with them, subject to resolv
ing certain conditions, be made a matter of record.
REST HOME : The Board's attention was called to the advisability of
either renewing the lease agreement on the Iron County
Rest Home with Lasca Hunt, present Lessee, at this time or otherwise proceeding
in connection with the matter. Following a brief discussion, the Commissioners
acted in favor of renewal with some possible modification as related to con-
sideration. Details to be worked out.
MISCELLANEOUS : A letter was read from IHC commending former Commissioner,
G. D. MacDonald for his services. Also a communication
from the citizens of Summit Town requesting a hearing on the Garbage Disposal

of Governments, but no formal action taken. Commissioner, Cleo Wood, reported on progress being made

Program. A letter was also read and considered from the Five County Association

in the obtaining of road rights-of-way in the Beal and Jones area.

DETENTION CENTER : Joseph E. Jackson, Esquire, Judge of the District Juvenile Court, and Larry Davis, Director of Court Services, met the Commissioners for purpose of getting acquainted, and to ask for criticism and recommendations regarding Juvenile Court problems. Explaining that there are inequities and lack of uniformity as between cities, counties, and schools as to how Juveniles are charged, referred, etc. Some serious offenses are not

properly handled. More referrals are coming from the Highway Patrol than from any other agency. Furthermore, there are restrictions on the type of facilities that may be used for Juvenile Detention.

Iron County facilities conform except for attendant requirements. If Iron County does not intend to provide the necessary supervision, it may contract with other Counties who have and are operating qualified facilities, as an alternative. They counseled that the Commissioners should take such action as may be necessary to better safeguard the County's interest.

ROADS

: Lynn Fiack, County Road Supervisor, appeared for the

purpose of reporting on progress being made on the survey and related items related to the Safety Program.

- 1. Signs.
- 2. Lengthening short culverts.
- 3. Guard rails on Cedar Mountain.
- 4. Modena crossing.

Mr. Fiack advised that the survey reports are due by February 15th, 1977, as well as a letter from the Commissioners directed to D.O.T. requesting that Iron County be permitted to participate in the program. Issuance of the letter was accordingly authorized.

ENGINEERING: Mr. Ralph B. Platt, Engineer, met with the Commissioners for purpose of discussing problems related to subdivision plat examination, and section corner placements. In connection with the later items he felt that the installation of section corners, except by well trained and closely supervised personnel, could result in some very undesirable consequences, and present policy should be reviewed as to the examination of subdivision plats, he stated that the present fee was not adequate, and that it should be changed from the present flat rate of \$50.00 first sheet, plus \$35.00 for each additional sheet, to a fee commensurate with actual cost involved. Both matters were taken under advisement.

AMBULANCE SUBJECT: Mr. Reed Embley and wife again appeared relative to his request that they subsidize his ambulance service in Iron County. Mr. Don Barnes, who had previously proffered to render the service without subsidy was also present.

Considerable discussion ensued which involved matter of obligation under the franchise, effect of two such businesses, equipment, trained personnel, etc. necessary, and the furnishing of financial statements.

No definite action was taken, except for the agreement of Mr. Embley to furnish financial statements requested, and the agreement of the

Commissioners to review the matter with Public Safety, which included Police and Fire Departments. Suggestion by Mr. Embley that an investigation be made by a third party was not acted upon.

SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL: A delegation representing Brian Head City with Rex

Emenegger as spokesman, appeared in company with Sherman

Dalton and Caudell Orton, representing D. & O. Sanitation, relative to the

County Solid Waste Disposal Program. In substance, Brian Head City sought

permission to haul their own solid waste to the County Pit, and be permitted

the service of the Pit on a fee per load basis.

Following a review of the request and proposal, a motion was passed, which was made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, duly seconded by Commissioner, H. Grant Seaman, approving the request and setting a temporary fee of \$25.00 per load.

HOLIDAYS: Joan Wasden, County Recorder, met with the Commissioners regarding County Policy with respect to holidays which fall on weekends. As a tentative measure, the Board advised that it would be satisfactory to follow the policy of the State of Utah.

MANPOWER QUESTION: The matter of County policy toward the sponsoring of employment of students under the ManPower Program was discussed, and a conclusion reached to invite Frank Dalley and Roy Miller of the Department of Employment Security to meet with the Commissioners at their next regular meeting, to more fully acquaint them with the Program.

STATE TAX COMMISSION: In order to more effectively reconcile some of the problems generated through the state reappraisal program in Iron County, it was concluded to also invite members of the Utah State Tax Commission to meet with the Board on February 23rd, 1977.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: In response to a request from the Paragonah Town Fire

Department as to if and when they should respond to a

fire outside the Town limits, it was concluded that in order to avoid mixing

of signals with the Parowan City Department, that their response should be

subject to call from the Parowan Department.

Attention of the Board was called to the fact that a Fair Board President had not been appointed for year of 1977. Accordingly, on motion duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, and seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, Mr. Art Walunas was reappointed as County Fair Board President for the said year of 1977.

SALARY INCREASES: The matter of salary increases for County employees came on for consideration, and after due deliberation, a motion was made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, that, with exception of the Commissioners, and a few secondary positions, a 12% across the Board increase, retroactive to January 1st, 1977, be provided. The motion was seconded by Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, the vote called for which was as follows:

SOLID

WASTE DISPOSAL : As the first matter of business, audience was given to al

Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd E. Tome to register their complaint regarding the existing Solid Waste Disposal Program of Iron County within the Special Services District, and the matter of adequate dog control.

Considerable discussion ensued relative to subject problems through which the Tomes were fully apprised of means being employed by the Commissioners in an effort to find a reasonable and fair solution to the garbage dilemma, and avenues open to them in dealing with their alleged dog problem.

Department of Employment Security, appeared on invitation from the County Commissioners, for purpose of explaining the Man Power Program as it related to Iron County outside the corporate limits of Cities and Towns.

MAN POWER PROBLEM : Mr. Frank Dalley and Roy Miller, representing the State

Mr. Dalley explained that the Five County Association of Governments had received an allotment of some \$814,000.00 to fund the Man Power Program, only, for Beaver, Garfield, Kane, and Washington Counties. That Iron County's allotment for areas outside incorporated Cities and Towns, would come as a separate and additional item direct from the State Department in charge. That to implement the program outside incorporated Cities and Towns, there were three possibilities.

- 1st, The County could run its own program, assuming all administrative and related costs.
- 2nd, The Program could be left status-quo, and thus be administered istered by the Department of Employment Security. Explaining that under present policy, the Department may not be in a position to or, for that matter, willing to administer the program for the County Outside District. Wherefore, this may not be an option.
- 3rd, Iron County could accept the invitation of the Five County Association of Governments, and permit them to handle Iron County's Man Power Program for this year at no cost to the County. In this event the allotment would be remitted to them as an addition to the present allotment for Beaver, Garfield, Kane, and Washington.

Mr. Dalley recommended the latter alternative due to its increased flexibility, and the matter of administrative costs.

Commissioner, James L. Clark, made a motion that the program be assigned for implementation to the Five County Association of Governments, the motion lacked a second and was tabled to the regular March 9th, meeting.

AGING COUNCIL: Mr. Rulon Woodbury, Chairman of the County Aging Council, and Mrs. Yuk Jun Joseph, Program Director, met with the Commissioners seeking authorization to apply for Title 20 funds with which to purchase a Mini-bus or Mini-buses, and to finance a nutrition program. The matter was discussed at length, and then tabled by the Board to permit a number of persons to be heard who, according to Chairman Seaman, had requested such an opportunity of him.

VALLEY VIEW

MEDICAL CENTER: Reginald Hughes, Administrator of the Valley View

Medical Center, appeared for purpose of presenting for
the Board's consideration a number of items of deficiencies which will need
to be made up at the Valley View Medical Center, to assure accreditation.

Explaining that without accreditation the Nurses Training Program at S.U.S.C.
may be jeopardized, and with correction of deficiencies, insurance rates will
also be less.

Also, suggestions to remedy financial problems related to low occupancy, including benefits to come through volume purchasing.

This being an informative discussion, no action was taken, none being necessary.

inquiry as to bidding proceedure on County Signs. In as much as the present signing program is being handled by the State Department of Transportation, it was suggested that he call on them at their offices in Cedar City.

ROAD MATTERS: Mr. Lynn Fiack, County Road Supervisor, petitioned the

Explaining that tires obtained from the bidder were not measuring up in quality

to his job requirements, and he would prefer having the authority to purchase

GRASSHOPPER SPRAY: At the request of the Board of County Commissioners,

Mr. Ray Anker, prepared and reported on equities involved in what is known as the Thorley mountain property which came under the
Grasshopper Control Program conducted during the summer of 1976 in Cedar Mountains. The cause and reason for the review and report being the contention of
Lula Thorley that she had been billed for the total acreage, whereas a share
of the total bill should have been levied against each equity holder. After
Mr. Anker's report had been reviewed, a revised billing was authorized.

CIRCUIT-COURT: Mr. D. Christian Ronnow, Judge of the City Court,

Cedar Coty, met the Board in support of legislation creating a Circuit Court System for the State of Utah, as contained in a bill now pending before the Legislature.

gation who wished to be heard, had been heard, they were advised by the Board that they were well aware of the basics of their arguments and in many respects their position was well taken, but that there were certain factors related to the case, one of which was the demand for subsidy, that placed the Commissioners in a position of perhaps not being able to give the highest priority to factors held out by the delegation. ROAD MATTER: It was reported to the Commissioners that a road in the

Buckhorn Flat area leading from Highway 91, into the

Cottonwood area, had been closed, plowed up and now raising crops. Commissioner,

Cleo Wood, was assigned to investigate.

Subsequently, however, Mr. Lynn Fiack, County Road Supervisor, was consulted, and he advised that this, to his knowledge, had never been accepted or considered to be a County Road. He said that it was very possible, though, that a use right-of-way had been established, and the road should not have been closed. He to investigate as to what action, if any, may be necessary on the part of the County.

MINI-BUS PROGRAM: A delegation of Senior Citizens, headed by Mrs. Yuk Jun

Joseph, met the Commissioners relative to a recent request

made by them for authorization to apply for Title 20 Funds for purpose of funding
the purchase of and operation of a Mini-Bus Program in Iron County.

Chairman Seaman advised them that these funds are not now available, and if and when they are it will no doubt require County matching funds to obtain them. This would necessitate a review of County finances and budget for sources from which to obtain said matching funds.

A considerable discussion ensued relative to the subject which included results of the ballot survey, which showed 221 for and 42 against of those responding, responsibility to the taxpayers, responsibility of the individual, and families, and areas of justifiable need.

The delegation placed some emphasis on being afforded the opportunity of taking advantage of funds available for this purpose.

Mrs. Joseph suggested that the Commissioners re-read the ordinance and comply with its requirements.

weed Program: Mr. Lynn Esplin, County Agent, met with the Commissioners relative to the obtaining of bids on Weed Chemical for the current year. Authorization was given for a call for bids on basis of budgeted funds available.

Mrs Esplin recommended that a separate Weed Board be appointed to determine policy. No formal action in the matter was taken. It was recommended however, that Mr. Esplin suggest possible candidates for appointment.

He also suggested that all Commissioners attend a Weed Seminar March 29th and 31st, 1977.

A motion was duly passed authorizing attendance, which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and seconded by Chairman, H. GrantSeaman. . Mr. Elvin Webster, Television Maintenance Supervisor, presentedja request from Mr. R. Kent Parsons of Monroe, Utah, for an appropriation by Iron County of some \$2,404.96 as its share in upgrading the translator equipment at the Lavan site. Following a brief review, a motion was passed which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood and seconded by Commissioner, H. Grant Seaman, approving the request, if found to be within the scope of the budget appropriation for television purposes 1977. GARBAGE DISPOSAL : Mr. Lloyd Tome, of Garden Park, Estates, inquired as to whether or not final decision had been reached on the Garbage Disposal Program. He was advised that a meeting was scheduled at 1 P.M. today with D. & O. Sanitation in a further effort to resolve the matter. ROAD MATTER : Eleanor McGovern of Fife Town, complained of trash along the Lund Highway, and the condition of roads in Fife Town. The Commissioners explained that roads in Fife Town are not on the County Road System primarily for the reason that they have not been brought to County Standards, but also for the reason that occupancy and use do not meet requirements of the Subdivision Ordinance. Nevertheless, County Road Supervisor, Lynn Fiack, will be asked to investigate.

EASEMENT: Kendall O. Gurr, representing Gurr Farms, met with the

Commissioners in an effort to obtain an easement for
going under the County Road in the Gurr Farms area, with a ten-inch water line
inside a metal culvert. Proffering to construct and compact, etc. according to
specifications furnished by the County, and to hold the County harmless from
any liability which may result from the installation. Easement was granted upon

EAIR GROUNDS: Mayor, Kendall O. Gurr and Councilmen Gayle Wood and Gale

of the County Fair Grounds. (The Parowan City Race Track and Rodeo Grounds.)

ORGANIZATION: Mr. Earl Hansen, of Cedar City, presented a petition signed by some one hundred and thirty-nine citizens of the County, supporting a change in tax assessment policy being sponsored by hime and his organization. In substance, the proposed change woulddshift the property tax burden from improvements, inventory, personal etc. exclusively to land.

Mr. Hansen was given a hearing on the subject, advised of the present statutory requirements relative to property tax assessments, and the fact that the implementation of his proposal would no doubt require a constitutional amendment and most certainly, action by Legislature.

#### FORESTRY

AND FIRE CONTROL: Mr. Ron Larson, representing the Utah State Forestry and

Fire Control Department, met the Commissioners for purpose of
presenting a proposed agreement by and between his department and Iron County spelling out the details for operating the Cooperative Fire Control Program during the
upcoming fire season. The proposed agreement was accepted and executed for and on
behalf of Iron County by CommissioneChairman, H. Grant Seaman.

ROAD MATTERS: Mr. Lynn Fiack, County Road Supervisor, reported on his investigation of the road closure problem leading into what is termed the Cottonwood area from Highway 91, Buckhorn Flat. After discussing his findings with the County Commissioners and the County Attorney, it was concluded that no County responsibility existed in connection with the problem.

Mr. Glen Halterman of Parowan had approached the County
Commissioners regarding fencing and road work on south side of Midvalley Road as
related to property in which he has an interest. It was reported for the record,

TRANSIENT ROOM TAX: Mr. Garth Jones, County Publicity and Tourist Development

Director, requested the appointment or reappointment of

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Board of Iron County Commissioners held in Commission Chambers, at the Courthouse, Parowan, Utah, beginning at the hour of 9 A. M.

Officers in attendance were:

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

as to the condition of the County Road leading from US 91 VIA Fremont Wash to his ranch property in Fremont Canyon, and to request that repair and maintenance be provided. Included in his request was four cattleguards, would settle for two, spot graveling and grading.

The Commissioners agreed to investigate, and to take such action as would seem to be justifiable under the circumstances.

Commissioner, Cleo Wood reported that he and County Road
Supervisor, Lynn Fiack, had investigated the problem and proffer heretofore made
by Mr. Wendall Rindlisbach of Monta Vista Subdivision, and found themselves agreeable to maintaining three hundred and ten feet of roadway fronting or approaching
his property in Monta Vista Subdivision, if and when he brings the road to a
County oiled surface standard. Mr. Rindlisbach to be so advised.

Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, reported on further investigation made by him on the problem heretofore raised in connection with the road leading from Highway 91 in the Buckhorn Flat area into Cottonwood. He advised that, even though Iron County has not or does not now recognize this as a County Road, possibly the best solution would be to obtain a right-of-way located in another area, following property line, from Joe Zitting and others in exchange for the apparently established right-of-way which crosses the said owners property in an area to which he raised some objection. It was concluded that a member of the Board of Iron

County Commissioners should visit Mr. Zitting about the matter.

WALLEY MEETING: Chairman Seaman also reported on a couple of informal meetings which the Commissioners had held with residents of Escalante Valley under date of April 12th, 1977. WATER TANK : A second request was for a 1,000 to 1,200 gallon water tank mounted on wheels, to support their fire fighting equipment. Commissioner, Cleo Wood, agreed to investigate this item and report. \_: A third matter was for finance to maintain their Community Center. It being understood that they would submit a detailed statement before any formal consideration is given. \_: Mr. Rulon Woodbury, Chairman of the County Aging Council, AGING PROGRAM and Yuk Jun Joseph, Director, appeared before the Board with a recommendation that the entire Aging Program be transferred from Iron County to the County School District for administration. Citing the fact that the School District is already quite actively involved through the supplying of office space, secretarial assistance, conveyances, etc. They explained that the School Board had not yet been approached on the matter, and before such a contact is made they wished to obtain the reaction of the Commissioners relative to the proposal. Following a brief discussion, the delegates were authorized

SOCIAL SERVICES: A delegation comprised of Keith Stroud, and Dr. A. John

Bennee, representing the Regional Division of Social

Services, appeared before the Board for purpose of presenting a review of Iron

to explore the proposal with the School Board, as well as any legal restrictions

pertaining to the transfer, and report the results for further deliberation by

County's status relative to the Mental Health Program. Following a brief discussion of its present status, they then explained the options open to Iron County for continuance of the Program.

- Continue as is, no fund participation and accept four man days per week program.
- Iron County could contract independently with the State Department of Social Services on a participating basis of 60% County - 40% State.
- Agree to enter into contract with the Department @ a rate of \$3,600.00 per year and receive existing services.

They explained that they needed to know what Iron County's wishes were by May 1st, 1977, in order for them to know how to proceed. The Commissioners agreed to consider and report.

### DRUG AND

ALCOHOL SCHOOL: Maude Fairbanks, representing the University of Utah on

Drug and Alcohol Abuse, met the Commissioners for purpose
of selling them on the idea of sponsoring two candidates to their School on

Drug and Alcohol Abuse, scheduled for June 19th to 24th, 1977.

Upon passage of a motion which was made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, duly seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, the request was granted.

POWER MATTER: Mr. Jess Pickett, Gayle Wood, and Steven Grimshaw, representing the Parowan and Cedar Valley Pumpers Association, appeared for the purpose of requesting financial assistance from Iron County in support of their effort to combat rising power costs in the County. Explaining that to whatever degree they were successful in holding the line on their own rising power rates, most of the citizens of Iron County would to that same degree benefit, and therefore, as a matter of equity, should share in the cost. Based on their total cost at the recent hearings of \$7,708.43, they suggested that Iron County appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00.

Following a brief discussion, on motion of Commissioner,

James L. Clark, duly seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and with all Commissioners voting in the affirmative, the request was denied. May be reconsidered later.

Elvid Williams, met the Board for the purpose of protesting the 1976 assessment for general tax purposes on some 290 acres of land in west Cedar Valley, which he admitted had been subdivided, but not improved. After a review of the matter, the Commissioners advised Mr. Williams that:

No. 1. His request for adjustment, in order to meet the requirements of law, should have been presented

at the Equalization meeting called in 1976 for this purpose.

No. 2. Since it was subdivided property, a fact which was a matter of record, it was doubtful that the valuation imposed was out of line.

Wherefore, they saw no justification to, or authority for making any adjustment at this time.

Ray Thomas Enterprises made application for waiver of penalty, enterest, and costs on certain 1976 delinquent tax accounts on property in western Iron County, which they claim was the result of oversight on the part of their office personnel.

This request was also denied.

Mr. H. Dee White, County Assessor, and Dale Bergeson, a representative from the Utah State Tax Commission, appeared for the purpose of obtaining from the Commissioners instructions as to how and when they, the Commissioners, would prefer that damages to residents in Cedar City due to land movement, be reflected on tax assessments. Should the necessary adjustments be reflected in the original assessments, or should the original assessments ments show original values, and wait for the Equalization period to make requested adjustments.

Following a discussion at length, by unanamous vote on a motion made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, and seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, the Board went of record as favoring now showing values on properties affected as near present actual values, after due consideration for sustained damages, as is possible.

GARBAGE DISPOSAL: Sherman Dalton, representing D. & O. Sanitation, again appeared for further consideration of the County Solid Waste Disposal program.

The question of service fee collection was first discussed, resulting in the County Attorney advising that he doubted that this responsibilityy could be delegated by Iron County to D. & O. Sanitation.

Second, with respect to the amount of the fee, D. & O. agreed that the total fee could be reduced to \$3.50, and .50¢ could be retained by Iron County to cover collection costs.

Third, it was agreed that the ordinance creating the Service District should and could be amended to exclude Summit Townsite, and the west Quitchipaw area.

EEASE: Mr. Boyd Kay and associate, representing Ameco Products,
appeared for purpose of negotiating a lease with Iron

County for the mineral rights to 320 acres of land in sections 8 and 9, Township

34 South, Range 17 West, SLB&M, at a fee of \$2.00 per acre.

Following a brief review, a motion was duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and duly seconded by Commissioner, H. Grant Seaman, authorizing Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, to execute the lease for and on behalf of Iron County. Commissioner, James L. Clark, abstaining.

saw MILL : Joseph Miner, and Phil Carter, residents of Cedar Valley, and Glen Hubbard, appraiser for Prudential Federal Savings and Loan, met the Board to register their protest to the establishment of a saw mill between 3200 North and 3600 North on Bull Dog Road, Cedar Valley. Each was awarded time within which to present his argument, which was followed by a general discussion.

Whereupon, it was concluded to channel a review of the matter through the Planning Commission to the Board of Adjustment. Pending action by these two bodies, on motion of Commissioner, James L. Clark, duly seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, with all Commissioners voting in the affirmative, issuance of a building permit for the saw mill was authorized to be delayed.

ALCOHOL FOUNDATION: Leighton Dennett and Bruce Adams, representing the Utah

Alcoholic Foundation, appeared for purpose of requesting

financial aid from Iron County for funding of the Alcohol Recovery Home in Cedar

City, They explained that they had been runningaa \$22,000.00 deficit, and requested an appropriation from Iron County of \$1.00 per capita.

The Commissioners advised them that they were not in a position to make such an appropriation at this time, but would review the matter in connection with next year's budget.

Eids received in response to the County's invitation to bid for the furnishing of tires for the Road and Sheriff's Department for the next fiscal period were opened and read aloud. Only one bid having been received, that of Dix Tire Company, it was declared lowest and best and awarded.

OWNERSHIP PLATS: Joan Wasden, County Recorder, presented for the Board's consideration, a review of the new law with respect to County ownership plats, and possible additional financial costs that may flow

therefrom. In as much as the law in not yet in effect, or a plan of proceedings established, no action was necessary on the part of the Commissioners at this time, and none was taken.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

: Mr. H. Dee White, County Assessor, appeared for the purpose of explaining to the Board that the same building had been assessed to two different tax payers under serial numbers D-644 and D-644-1, and requested authorization to make the necessary equitable adjustment. He was so authorized.

Mr. Elvid Williams again appeared in support of a protest heretofore entered by him to the assessed valuation placed on a subdivision owned by him for the year of 1976 and listed under serial number E-171-2.

The Commissioners again reviewed the matter with him, and found that since there was no obvious error in acreage, improvements, etc. and since he had failed to file a timely protest, he was barred under the law from the relief which he sought. Nevertheless, they agreed to refer the matter to the State Tax Commission for review of their, (the County Commissioners) findings and for correction, if appropriate under the circumstances.

GRASSHOPPER CONTROL: Commissioner, Cleo Wood, called on for consideration the Special Services fee, in the nature of grasshopper control, charged by Iron County for the year of 1976 against Lula Thorley and Morton Thorley. Since their acreage equity in total property serviced was found to be equal to that of Roe Thorley, as a matter of equity, it was concluded to re-bill them on same basis as that applied to the property of the said Roe Thorley.

GENERATOR EQUIPMENT: In response to invitation of Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, Cates

Equipment Company, presented for the Board's consideration,

price quotations on a 250 kilowatt generator for the Valley View Medical Center.

The quotation was reviewed and tabled for possible further consideration, depending upon the results of further lease agreement negotiations with I.H.C.

ANSWERING SERVICE: Mr. Bill Sherratt, of Cedar City, who has installed and is operating a telephone answering service, approached the

Commissioners relative to the possibility of Iron County financially supporting direct telephone line service for portions of the County which are not now on the Cedar City exchange.

Following a brief discussion, Mr. Sherratt was instructed to submit a detailed report on costs involved in connection with his proposal, for study and review, before any type action is taken.

DETENTION CENTER: Mr. Michael Hyatt, of Cedar City, met with the Commissioners for purpose of discussing matter related to the position of attendant at the County Juvenile Detention Center, for which application had been requested.

In substance, it was learned that Mr. Hyatt, at this point in time, was interested only in a full time position, and since this one was not full time, he doubted that he would have any further interest in it. He requested however, an opportunity to give it further consideration before making a definite decision.

CIVIL DEFENSE: Mr. Haldow E. Christensen, County Civil Defense Director,
met the Commissioners for purpose of reporting on the
activities of his Department. Among other matters, he advised that new regulations have been imposed relative to title to property obtained through G.S.A.
Title now on property received to be vested in either the State or County rather
than the Federal Government.

Among these was the identification of roads in Iron County on which Federal Aid Secondary Funds may be spent, and specific limitations with respect thereto. He also requested a recommendation as to priorities to be established for the expenditures of Collector Road Maintenance Funds. Following a review of the qualified

projects, it was concluded to give first priority to the road running from High-way 56 at the Escalante Valley Crossroads north toward the Beryl Railroad Station. Another matter discussed, was the Utah Department of Transportation's intention to improve the East off-ramp approach to Cedar City VIA Minersville Highway 130 at the North Cedar City Interchange, and their desire that Iron County assist in obtaining necessary right-of-way. AGING PROGRAM: The request, as heretofore presented by the County Aging

Council, for permission to transfer the administration of

their program from Iron County to the Iron County School District, was called on for consideration. Following a discussion at length, and following assurance from the County Attorney that there were no legal obstacles to the County Commissioners delegating the authority to the County School Board, a motion was duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and seconded by Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, authorizing implementation of the proposal for a one year experimental period beginning with July 1st, 1977; The County Attorney explained that most of the regulatory provisions of the Ordinance establishing the Council, as pertaining to their relationship with the County Commissioners, would still be effective and would have to be complied with, however.

LEASE AGREEMENT: The matter of what action should be taken at this time relative to a proposed lease by and between Iron County and I.H.C. covering the Valley View Medical Center, came on for consideration. After due deliberation, subject to two possible modifications desired by the Commissioners, a motion was duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and seconded by Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, approving and accepting the lease agreement, and authorizing Chairman, H. Grant Seaman to execute the same for and on behalf of Iron County.

ELOOD CONTROL: Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, reported on a meeting which he attended with the Cedar City Council, to hear and receive a recognizance report on a small flood control project for Coal Creek as proposed by the Army Corps of Engineers. The Army Corps was represented by Mr.

Lee McQuivey. Commissioner, H. Grant Seaman reported that Cedar City had voted to move forward with the tentative plan of improvement, and since Iron County was a party to the original request for an investigation of the Coal Creek problem, asked that they join in submitting a formal request. Accordingly, a motion was passed, which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and seconded by Commissioner, H. Grant Seaman, providing that Iron County join with Cedar City in a request for the proposed project, and authorizing Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, to sign the letter for and on behalf of Iron County.

MENTAL HEALTH: The question of what disposition to make of the pending

Mental Health Program proposed for Iron County as posed

by Keith Stroud, representative of the Social Services Administration, at the

previous meeting, was called on for consideration. Following a brief review,

a motion was duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and seconded by Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, providing that Iron County exercise and

EMR. H. Dee White, County Assessor, presented for the Boards consideration, a protest from the Parowan American Legion Post to the assessing, for general tax purposes, of property owned by them in Parowan City. Considerable discussion ensued as to the status of the property and its use, and a decision reached to have the County Assessor first consult with the State Tax Commission, Department on exempt property, before any action is taken.

MILEAGE RATE: County mileage rate being paid individualsy for use of their own cars on County business, was called on for review and consideration. Rates being paid by the State of Utah and the Federal Government were obtained by telephone for comparative purposes.

After all factors had been given such weight as would seem to the Commissioners to be appropriate under the circumstances, a motion was duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, and seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, providing that the County rate remain at 12¢ per mile.

WOODS RANCH: Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, reported that Morgan Slack, attendant at the Woods Ranch Recreation Area, had advised him that certain repairs were urgently needed at the Park on the water line.

Commissioner Wood, also advised that some attention is needed on the roads.

Wherefore, on motion duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, and seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, both items were authorized. The road matters to be attended to by County road equipment enroute to service the road from U-14, to Aspen Lakes area.

WATER MEETING: At the request of Joe Melling, representative of the Five

County Region, on a Water Quality Study, the Commissioners

LOW INCOME HOUSING: The Commissioners had been advised that Iron County had been allocated some \$3,410.00 to assist in rehabilitating homes of qualifying persons in Iron County. The Board expressed themselves as feeling that the amount presently allocated was not sufficient to justify the administrative costs, and that the amount should either be allowed to accumulate or be transferred (if proper) to another governmental entity of the County as a supplement to the amount allocated to them. The matter to be investigated.

CLEAN UP

: Chairman, Seaman, reported that the Utah Department of

Transportation, through him, had requested that Iron County join them in sponsoring a Clean Up Program, especially along highways, for the period running from May 15th, to May 21st, 1977. The Board agreed to cooperate, as well as to seek cooperation of the citizens of the County, and to allow them free access to the garbage pit, during this period, for the dumping of clean up trash as an additional incentive.

Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, also requested and received authorization to head up a committee to improve the appearance and grounds of County owned facilities.

BOOK SHELVES: Sheriff, Ira Schoppmann, and County Precinct Justice,

Haldow E. Christensen, appeared for the purpose of seeking
authorization to install book shelves in an office jointly used by them in the
City and County Building at Cedar City. On motion of Commissioner, Cleo Wood,
duly seconded by Commissioner, James L. Clark, and with all Commissioners voting
in the affirmative, they were so authorized.

TWO-WAY RADIO: A request previously made and previously considered for authorization to install a two-way radio in the County owned brush truck stationed with the Cedar City Fire Department, came on for further consideration. In accordance therewith, a motion was duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, and seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, granting the request.

SOLID WASTE: Mr. Ray Anker, County Building Inspector, appeared for purpose of reporting on an assignment previously made to h him by the Commissioners to obtaining reaction of contractors to a proposal to

place a special trash container at the construction site of new homes, and they (the contractors) pay a \$5.00 disposal fee, in order to leave other containers available to residents of the area.

He stated that contractors on the whole and living outside the area had no objections and were willing to cooperate. However, contractors and subcontractors residing in the area objected to paying a fee for the reason that they were already paying a fee for residential service.

The report was received and considered but no formal action taken with respect thereto, although there were indications that the Board considered the objections to have some merit.

Mr. Anker also reported on a request which he had received for a roadway to what he termed to be "the R.E. Anderson property," in Escalante Valley Ranchos Subdivision, Unit 14. He explained, however, that it was in the middle of the Subdivision, wherefore nothing could be done about it.

Further, Henry Schuder, requested that what is termed the "Austin Road," be extended and graded along north side of Unit 17.
Unit 17 shows 33 foot right of way for road along north side, but land adjacent to it does not show any right of way for road.

WATTS LINE : A brief discussion was had in connection with the possibility of the County being placed on a Watts line, in connection with telephone service. Concluded to investigate.

ANSWERING SERVICE: Mr. Bill Sherratt, by telephone, advised the Board as to the results of his investigation of probable cost for the establishing of County wide direct telephone service as related to his answering service.

While the Commissioners discussed the cost factors to some extent, they reserved any formal action pending investigation of Watts line, and any possibility of the entire County being placed on one exchange.

QUIT CLAIM DEED: In response to a request from Mr. Doyle Jolley, DBA,

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

JOB SERVICE: Mrs. Ruby Webster, representing Job Service, met the Commis sioners for the purpose of encouraging the County to use the services of their Department in hiring of employees. In response to her inquiry, the Board indicated that they had no objection to her contacting Department Heads with respect to the matter.

EASEMENT AGREEMENT: Mr. Robert L. Gardner, Esquire, representing Enoch Town,

Inc. submitted for Commission approval and endorsement, a

formal Easement Agreement for the installation of an underground water line in
the right-of-way of the Midvalley Road, Iron County, Utah, more particularly
described as follows:

With respect to billing for services, it was concluded after considerable discussion, that all residents within the services district should be billed, and that application for exception should be filed with the Board of County Commissioners and each application be considered by them on its merits.

Commissioner, James L. Clark, reported that Court action is contemplated by Midvalley residents who stand in opposition to the County Solid Waste Disposal System.

Protest was made to Mr. Dalton on the locating of containers on private property without permission. He explained that he had not heretofore been made aware of any such situation, but upon being so advised he would move such container within twenty-four hours. He also stated that there were 105 containers located in Midvalley, and that all were being used.

CIVIL DEFENSE : Mr. H. E. Christensen, County Civil Defense Director,

and Mr. Willard Fawcett, representing the State Civil

Defense Department, met the Commissioners to report on the present status of the

County E.O.C. Among other matters they indicated that the standby generator was

not yet completely functional, and that necessary communication equipment had not
as yet been programmed. Indicating that the completion of these two segments

would make the center operational. Final inspection will be made, however,

upon perfecting of the functioning of the generator. Sheriff Schoppmenn added t

that installation of the Communication System would be a real support to the

efficiency of his Department.

Department, reported that another house had been lost in Cedar Valley because of lack of water and improper construction. Suggesting that the Subdivision Ordinance should include some regulatory provision with respect to fire protection. Mr. Bentley also stated that in his opinion existing

duplication of County Fire Services with State Forestry and Fire Control Department, is not desirable. Better to appropriate money now being allocated to the State Department, to Parowan City and let them service the area. Sheriff Schoppmann concerned.

ROAD SIGNS: In response to Sheriff'Schoppmann's request for at least twelve raod signs, Commissioner, Cleo Wood advised that they were on order through the State Prison, but since there seems to be considerable delay in their response, perhaps the Order should be cancelled and one placed with someone capable of making a more prompt response.

American Legion Post 20, appeared in protest to their property on main and first north being assessed for tax purposes. They presented evidence in support of their contention that the property was not producing revenue in excess of expenses, and made their claim for exemption on the grounds that they were a non profit charitable organization.

The Commissioners expressed themselves as being in Sympathy with their position, but no formal action was taken at this time.

AMBULANCE SERVICE: It was reported to the Board that Don Barnes was having some difficulty in obtaining finance to purchase a back up unit of equipment, wherefore, the County may have to consider other alternatives, perhaps in cooperation with Cedar City.

watts system: Mr. Kay Peterson of Mountain Bell, met the Commissioners, at their invitation, to present a proposal relative to the benefits and comparative costs associated with the County going to a Watts system. After comparative costs and benefits had been discussed at some length, a motion was unanamously passed, which was made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, and seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, providing that Iron County invest inaat least one Watts line, while further study is being made.

ANSWERING SERVICE: Inquiry was made as to the present attitude of the Board toward the request that the County subsidize a County

Answering Service. They agreed to make further studies concerning costs, etc.

ROADS: Through Commissioner, James L. Clark, Cottonwood Subdivision requested that approximately one-quarter mile of Bull Frog Road west of Cottonwood Subdivision be oiled to alleviate the dust problem. Commissioner, Cleo Wood, indicated that the project would have to be considered and assigned a priority status compatable with available funding.

tation be requested to install a stop sign on old Highway 91 at its intersection with the Minersville road south of Garden Park Subdivision. LOW COST HOUSING : Matter related to disposition of funds allocated to Iron County for rehabilitation of indigent housing was discussed. Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, to follow through. No apparent need at this time. BOOKMOBILE : Commissioner, James L. Clark, presented a letter from the Town of Brian Head, in which they solicited Bookmobile service. Explaining that the Utah State Library Board had expressed a willingness to pay 50% of the cost, and they (Town of Brian Head) petitioned the Commissioners to supply the other 50% of cost. The Commissioners were first desirous of being informed as to what the cost would be before taking action. A number of residents from the Highland Park Subdivision appeared for the purpose of seeking tax relief through adjustments in assessed valuation on their property for damage caused by soil on earth movement.

Harry B. Leigh appeared as spokesman for the group.

First, they approached the problem from standpoint of land values, contending that a lot which would not support a home becomes worthless and should be reduced to a valuation of zero on the assessment rolls.

Considerable discussion ensued resulting in the Board agreeing to consider each lot on an individual basis, and those proven not to be able to support a home free of substantial damage due to earth movement, to be reduced to a \$50.00 minimum, with such adjustment to be reflected on the 1977 assessment rolls.

Second, Mr. Leigh requested for and on behalf of the Delegation, that each home or building in the subdivision which has subtained adamage, be individually examined and appraised and appropriate adjustment made in the assessed valuation of the buildings. The Delegation was advised that this had already been done. Some of the adjustments being reflected on the 1977 valuation notices and some were not, nevertheless they were assured that all changes would be reflected on the 1977 assessment rolls. The following listed property owners registered their dissatisfaction with the adjustments, and Craig Hansen, of the State Tax Commission agreed to re-examine the premises of each and report his findings to the Board of Equalization for their consideration:

AMBULANCE SERVICE: Don Barnes and Associates appeared at approximately 3:30 or 4:00 P. M. to explain that they had been supplying public service at ball games, rodeo events, etc. for which they had anticipated being paid, and for which they have now determined that they were expected to donate, and as a result funds anticipated to cover insurance costs are not

available. Wherefore, since they calculate that they have furnished some \$1,600.00 in public service during the month, they were asking that Iron County subsidize them in the amount of \$800.00 per month pending their becoming better financially stabilized.

The Commissioners urged them to make every effort to obtain some finance from agencies to whom they have provided service, and report for further consideration of the matter.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

#### STATE

MEDICAL PROGRAM: As the first matter of business, a communication, consisting of an inquiry from the State of Utah as to whether or not Iron County intended to participate in the State Indigent Medical Aid Program, was considered and on motion duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, and seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, a decision not to participate was approved.

MAN POWER: It was reported to the Board that thirty five (35) youths were employed in the five County region under the Man Power Program. Kane County-5, Iron County-16, and Washington County-14.

FIRE CONTROL : A billing was received and considered from the U.S. Forest

Service for a chemical drop on Bald Mountain. It was tabled,
however, for more information.

Saddle Club of Parowan, for an appropriation of funds to assist them with the purchase and equiping of a water truck to be used for dust control at the Parowan City Race Track and Rodeo Grounds. This item was discussed briefly and tabled for further consideration.

ROAD MATTER: Mr. Tom Holland of New Castle appeared for purpose of requesting that some action be taken to alleviate dust problems generated by traffic on the streets at New Castle. The Commissioners agreed to investigate possible means of solution.

insurance Policy had served notice of cancellation effective July 1st, 1977. Accordingly, consideration was first given to a call for bids, but the idea was subsequently waived in favor of a decision to have

the agent simply transfer the policy to another company, due to the time element involved in notice and preparation for a bid call.

The interest of Iron County in the re-zoning of certain property located on Holyoak Lane, was called on for consideration. From information available, it would appear that Parowan City had advertised and held a public hearing on the portion of the tracts located in the County as well as the portion lying within the Corporate limits of Parowan City, thus creating a legal problem as to what further action may be necessary on the part of Iron County. Hans Q. Chamberlain, County Attorney, to investigate and make recommendation.

DRAINAGE PROBLEM: The drainage problem at the County Courthouse created by the Parking Lot was again considered, and a conclusion reached to make and effort to run an underground drainage pipe west to main street across the Lee Winter property if and provided the necessary right-of-way can be obtained, and it was reported that it could be. Arrangement to be made for running of grade, etc.

GARBAGE DISPOSAL: A delegation of eight (8) citizens from Mid Valley appeared in protest to the present garbage disposal program employed by Iron County within the existing service district. A number of specific objections were registered, including but not limited to the following:

- 1. Location of containers
- 2. Signs instructing dumpers
- 3. Want service discontinuted
- 4. Want ballot on service
- 5. Containers not adequate
- 6. Continuation Ordinance not legal.

The delegation was advised that a majority of the Commission favored, with perhaps some modification if found to be advisable, of the program as presently in effect.

AMBULANCE SERVICE: Don Barnes, again appeared with respect to problems being experienced with respect to adequately funding his Ambulance Program. A report was made on what his needs were, what his billings were, necessary expenses and percentage collections. The Commissioners concluded to first meet with Cedar City and Parowan City officials and make a determination as to what might be worked out on a cooperative basis before taking any positive action.

: Mr. D.E.RBones appeared for purpose of protesting payment
of back taxes levied against him on omitted property listed
under seriallnoo D-564-1-25. Protest was reviewed and denied.

COUNTY GOVERNMENT: A Mr. Robert Price from Mid Valley appeared in an effort to stimulate on the part of the Commissioners, an interest in modifying the form of County Government. He was most especially interested in a change to provide for five County Commissioners. He urged that a study be made of the possibilities.

Mr. Price was heard on the matter, but no formal action was taken by the Board at this time.

HUMAN SERVICES: Mr. Rachard Lord, Human Services Planner, met the Commissioners to explain services programmed under Title XX. Stating that the Five County Area had received an allocation of some \$136,000.00. He in substance, gave a resume of the services which could be funded under the Program, such as Day Care, Mental Health, Alcoholic Center, Clinics, Legal Services, Work Release, Etc. Explaining that the County, in order to participate, must pay a match of 25%, and furthermore, that if they do not choose to join in the Program, services proveded thereby will be lost.

The Commissioners were appreciative of the opportunity of becoming better acquainted with services sponsored under Title XX, but were not prepared to take formal action at this time.

GARBAGE DISPOSAL: Jess Pickett, of Parowan Valley, met the Commissioners and advised that a problem existed relative to the present location of garbage containers placed to serve his vicinity. This matter to be taken up with D. & Q. Sanitation.

ROAD MATTERS: Mr. Lynn Fiack, County Road Supervisor, appeared and reviewed with the Commissioners problems related to his Department. These included:

- 1. Obtaining right-of-way from US 91 in the Buckhorn Flat area into Cottonwood.
- Dust problem in front of Tom Holland's residence at New Castle.
- 3. Dust coating Bull Dog Road.
- 4. Signing of Intersection of 130 and old Highway 91.

  Road Supervisor, Lynn Fiack, to investigate and make rec-

ommendations as advisable procedure, under the circumstances for solution.

GRAVEL DEPOSIT: Commissioner, Cleo Wood, advised the Board that he had been successful in negotiating with the State Land Board, subject to Commission approval, for the purchase of the NWZNWZ of Section 14, Township 35 south, range 17 west, SLB&M, as a gravel deposit, for a total consideration of \$4,122.86. Following a brief discussion, a motion was unanamously passed, which

was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and seconded by Commissioner, James L. Clark, approving the purchase, and authorizing a deposit of 10% plus a \$5.00 certificate fee.

the commissioners to discuss with them a number of detailed matters pertaining to the fulfillment of his contract with Iron County, and with which he was experiencing difficulty. Listed were such items as an accurate listing of homes being serviced, proximity of containers to roads, dead animals deposited and fly problems. Educating the public to advise D. & O. if containers are overloaded between pickups.

The Commissioners suggested that perhaps public relations could be improved by preparing and distributing a flyer to residents residing within the service district. D. & O. to prepare the flyer, and present it to the Commissioners for review and approval before distribution.

ANSWERING SERVICE: The question as to whether or not Iron County should or would subsidize the County Answering Service being established by Mr. Bill Sherratt, was called on for consideration, and by unanamous approval of a motion made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, and duly seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, the said application for subsidy was denied.

TRAVEL AUTHORIZED: Mrs. Joan Wasden, County Recorder, appeared for purpose of requesting authorization to attend a meeting in Provo for County Recorders, June 23rd, and to host and attend a like meeting in Parowan July 15th, 1977.

Both requests were granted.

OWNERSHIP PLATS: Mrs. Wasden also discussed questions and problems related to bringing the County Ownership Plats up to standard required by recent legislation. Questions raised dealt with adequate budgetary funding to handle the additional work load imposed, and standards to be met. The discussion was general and informative and required no formal action at this time.

The question of costs to operate the Zerox machine was also raised, including the advisability of purchase rather than rental. Mrs. Wasden was advised to review and present a report on costs, etc. for the Board's information and study.

SIDEWALKS: Mr. Alex Mansour, District Highway Engineer for the Utah

Department of Highways, discussed with the Commissioners
the possible profitable application of some \$12,000.00 allocated to Iron County

for the construction of sidewalks. It was proposed that, in cooperation with Parowan City, properly located sidewalks installed in Holyoak Lane would be feasible. The suggestion was accepted, and application for funds to be processed in conformity therewith.

MASTER PLAN: Mr. Wayne Iverson, of Brian Head, proposed to the Commissioners that the Town of Brian Head be authorized to prepare a Master Plan covering the incorporated area of Brian Head, and lands adjoining in Iron County.

Upon passage of a motion, which was made by Commissioner, H. Grant Seaman, and seconded by Commissioner, James L. Clark, such authorization to be conditional, however, upon the plan being submitted to the County Commissioners for study and review before it is approved, and the understanding that Iron County would supply no funding.

<u>250 K.W. GENERATOR</u>: Mr. Dave Houholin, of Cedar City, met with the Board at its invitation to counsel them with respect to bids received in response to the County's invitation to bid on the furnishing of a 250 K. W. generator to be installed at the Valley View Medical Center.

In as much as he found two of the bids received lacking somewhat in information necessary to make a satisfactory comparison, awarding ofbbids was delayed pending receipt of the said information.

ROAD MATTERS, ETC.: Mr. Hal Mitchell of Parowan, met with the Board seeking relief on a number of items.

- lst. He recommended that a sign limiting speed be placed just north of the North Parowan Interchange and in the area of the Bingo Service Station.
- 2nd. He requested that Iron County abandon an unused portion of the road in the immediate vicinity of the Bingo Service Station, and desired to know proceedings necessary to accomplish this.
- 3rd. He requested permission to run a 1 inch water line for about 1000 feet along the County right-of-way.

Following a brief discussion, it was concluded to assign County Road Supervisor, Lynn Fiack, to investigate each item listed and report his recommendations.

#### PLANNING

COMMISSION SECRETARY: Mr. Hal Mitchell, also advised that the County Planning

Commission is in need of a secretary. Accordingly, authorization was given to publish a call for applications. Rate set at \$2.50 per hour. Applicants must be able to type.

TAX MATTERS: Leatha G. Prestwich protested the assessed valuation placed on property listed under serial no. B-1030. Utah State

Tax Commission Appraiser, Gus Felt, assigned to investigate and report.

In connection with the Highland Park Subdivision home damage due to land movement, Mr. Felt recommended that property owners appeal individually to the Utah State Tax Commission.

The protest of Joyce Osborne to the assessed valuation placed on property owned by her and listed under serial no. C-1079, was also referred to Tax Commission Appraiser, Gus Felt, for review and adjustment, if any found to be appropriate.

Ellis and Clara S. Bryant, complained that, in their opinion assessed valuation placed on their home was excessive. Deputy Gounty Assessor, Randy Day, was assigned to investigate.

COUNTY FAIR : Mr. Art Walunas, President of the Iron County Fair Board,
filed a duplicate request to that of the Red Hill Wranglers,
heretofore stated, for financial assistance in obtaining and equipping a water
truck. In addition, however, he asked that the Commissioners respond favorably
to his request for funds to install additional facilities at the County Fair
Grounds.

The Commissioners advised, as a course Mr. Walunas knew, that they had budgeted a certain amount of funds for the County Fair, including funds to be used on a matching basis with Parowan City for entertainment and grounds improvement. Wherefore, the Board recommended that they work with Parowan City and establish a project priority listing for expenditure of these funds already appropriated, and if they determine that the obtaining of a water truck draws a first rating that the funds now appropriated may be so applied.

250 K. GENERATOR: Mr. Kent Brown, representing Cate Equipment Company, one of the bidders on the 250 K.W. generator, appeared to inquire as to status of bid. He was informed that an award was awaiting add-

#### REGULAR JUNE 22nd, 1977, MEETING

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Board of Iron County Commissioners, held in Commission Chambers at the Courthouse, Parowan, Utah, June 22nd, 1977, beginning at the hour of 9 A. M.

Officers in attendance were:

H. Grant Seaman, Commission Chairman Cleo Wood, Commissioner James L. Clark, Commissioner Clair Hulet, Clerk Hans Q. Chamberlain, Attorney

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and with minor corrections, approved.

Control Department, met the Commissioners for the purpose of explaining a bill filed against Iron County in the sum of \$1,060.40 to cover the cost of a tanker drop of fire retardant on the Bald Mountain fire of September 1st, 1976. It appeared from the discussion that the Commissioners had given temporary approval for the drop, but only for the reason that they were advised that cattle were in jeopardy from the fire, since the fire itself was on B.L.M. land. Later, however, upon investigation, the Commissioners had determined that the case had been misrepresented to them, that no cattle were involved, and therefore they were in no way responsible for the drop. Wherefore, they refused to pay.

The discussion with Mr. Larsen at this time, failed to change their attitude toward the matter, and the bill was again denied. Mr. Paul Sjoblom, State Forester, to be so advised.

## PARTICIPATION

AUTHORIZED: Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, advised the Board that he had been appointed to serve on one of the Committees of the Utah Association of Counties, and inquired as to their attitude toward his acceptance. On motion duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and seconded by Commissioner, James L. Clark, approval was given for his acceptance of the appointment as well as authorization for his attendance at regular meetings scheduled or to be scheduled for the Committee.

: Evelyn Dettamanti, representing the Red Hill Home Owners,

(a portion of the Highland Park Area) met the Commissioners
relative to assessed valuation adjustments proposed for the area due to damagege
caused by land movement. Assessor, H. Dee White, explained the position of the
County relative to the matter, including the fact that the valuation would not
reflect damage sustained since January 1st, 1977, since this is the date on which

assessments are based on all property for the current year. Forms were supplied for appeals to the Utah State Tax Commission by all those not satisfied with the County determination.

LPW ROUND II : Mr. Rex Emenegger, President of the Brian Head Town Board, appeared with regard to a number of items.

The first was with respect to obtaining County sponsorship for their application for EDA Funds. Following an informative discussion, a motion was duly passed, which was made by Commissioner, James L. Clark, and seconded by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, approving the request for County Sponsorship, and authorizing Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, to execute necessary documents connected therewith for and on behalf of Iron County. Mr. Emenegger indicated that upon compliance with all required regulations, Brian Head Town would be eligible for some \$77,000.00 under program identified as LPW Round II, which funds they intended to use primarily for water development.

Secondly, Mr. Emenegger requested that Iron County pay necessary matching funds to the State Library Commission to obtain for Brian Head, services of the Bookmobile, since they do not have the money. The matter was discussed at some length and a conclusion reached to first contact Mr. Stoker of the Library Commission and obtain details on what kind of an arrangement could be worked out with the State Agency, and at what cost.

The third item raised was that of the bill now due and owing Bush and Gudgel Engineers for services in connection with a proposed sewer line from Brian Head to Parowan VIA Parowan Canyon. Explaining that no move had been made by the Trustee of the Sewer Improvement District to levy the necessary tax to obtain the funds to pay the claim, and that some action appropriate under the circumstances, should be taken by some one with necessary authority to resolve the matter. He stated that the Town of Brian Head would assume no responsibility relative to the obligation, but that they were concerned.

Following a review of the matter, a recommendation was made that the Board of County Commissioners direct a letter to the Board of Trustees of the Sewer Improvement District, suggesting that they exercise their authority to the extent of implementing a tax against property within the District for the use and purpose of liquidating the debt. The Commissioners while having heretofore disclaimed any responsibility for creation of the obligation or its liquidation, nevertheless agreed to remind the Board of Trustees of its obligation.

COUNTY GOVERNMENT: Mr. Robert Price of Midvalley, appeared relative to his previous proposal that the Board of County Commissioner, take necessary action to reorganize County Government in Iron County, in such manner as to, among other things, provide for five (5) County Commissioners.

Following a brief discussion, Mr. Price stated that he had appeared for purpose of withdrawing his original proposal, and to, in its stead, propose that the Commissioners establish a Study Committee comprised of not less than seven (7) or more than eleven (11) members to study the matter and make recommendations.

While indicating that they would probably act favorably on the proposal, they reserved formal action until the first meeting in July.

Mr. Price also requested that action be taken to update the County Road Map. He was advised that the State Highway Department had one already prepared and consideration would be given to making this available to the public.

EASEMENT: The request of Hal S. Mitchell, of Parowan, for an easement for a one-inch water line along the County Road right-of-way north of the North Parowan Interchange, was called on for consideration. Commissioner, Cleo Wood, reported that the necessary investigation, as agreed upon, had now been made and there being no objection, was granted.

DEPUTY SHERIFF: The request of Sheriff, Ira Schoppmann, for the appointment of a part time or on call Deputy Sheriff for Escalante Valley, was considered and approved, subject to budget being adequate.
The County Attorney to make a determination as to whether or not the appointee would be subject to the rules of the merit system.

Burn Program on Public Lands, and more particularly, the Indiam Trail Burn on Boulder Mountain which has presently created considerable public reaction or objection to the application of this program. After a review of the subject, the Commission authorized the writing of a letter to each of our Congressional Delegation, advising them that in spite of the apparent miscalculated occurance in connection with the Indian Trail Burn, that the use of fire in connection with range management is still an effective tool, and that its use, properly managed, should not be abandoned or the program curtailed.

AMBULANCE: Mr. Don Barnes appeared relative to problems being encountered by him in staying financially afloat in his business of Ambulance Service. The matter was discussed at length, including

the question of County responsibility. As a temporary solution, a motion was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, duly seconded by Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, providing that Iron County subsidize Mr. Barnes up to but not in excess of \$2,000.00 in order to carry him to August 10th, 1977. During the interim, the Board to evaluate possible programs available for a more permanent solution to the problem, and take further action at that time.

The vote on the motion was:

## REGULAR JULY 13th, 1977, MEETING

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Board Of Iron County Commissioners, held in Commission Chambers at the Courthouse, Parowan, Utah, July 13th, 1977, beginning at the hour of 9 A. M.

Officers in attendance were:

H. Grant Seaman, Commission Chairman Cleo Wood, Commissioner James L. Clark, Commissioner (Absent) Hans Q. Chamberlain, Attorney Clair Hulet, Clerk

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

ELOOD CONTROL: As the first matter of business, Mr. Wray Macey, representative of Soil Conservation Service, was given audience for
purpose of informing the Commissioners concerning a Flood Control Project being
developed for the Paragonah area. Mr. Macey, by use of maps and charts, described the location, size, purpose, and contemplated costs. Explaining that
costs were tentatively estimated at \$249,000.00 federal, plus property acquisition
expense to be born by the local units, and \$1,500.00 annual maintenance.

While the presentation was purely informative, the Commissioners response was favorable, indication being that they would lend such support to the Project as they deemed to be advisable under the circumstances, with exception of financial, and that it should move forward.

Frank Dunton was present representing the Paragonah Town Board, and he agreed, for and on behalf of the said Board, to investigate the matter of land acquisition.

JUDGE'S QUARTERS: Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, advised the Board that he felt the question as to whether or not the District Court Judge is to continue to occupy space in the CSA building in Cedar City should be resolved, in fairness to the lessor. It was concluded that the Court should be contacted, and action be taken commensurate with his response. If the office now occupied by the Court is to be vacated, the lessor should be immediately so advised.

PUBLIC DEFENDER: Ray S. Shuey, Esquire, appeared before the Board for the purpose of proposing that the County renew its contract with the Salt Lake Legal Defenders Association for Legal Defenders services for the fiscal period running from August 31st, 1977 to August 31st, 1978, at a fee of \$6,099.00. This would result in an increase, if the previous years fee was annualized, of some \$1,200.00.

The proposal was discussed and tabled for study and a subsequent decision.

INSURANCE: Mr. Richard Hollingshead, was given a hearing for the purpose of presenting details on an Insurance Program or proposal. The matter was tabled for study and presentation of further details.

COPY MACHINE: Mrs. Joan Wasden, County Recorder, presented a statement, for the Board's consideration, relative to costs of rental less fees collected for the year of 1976 on the Xerox Copy Machine maintained in her office. This in support of her argument against a proposal to purchase a Savin 780, rather than to continue to rent the Xerox.

The statement was accepted and placed on file for further consideration.

ROAD MATTERS : Mr. Lynn Fiack, County Road Supervisor, appeared relative to a number of items:

- Summit Town had requested that he use County Road Equipment to cover their garbage pit.
  He was authorized to do so one time only.
- He requested and received authorization to proceed with seal coating that portion of the Cedar Breaks-Panguitch Lake Road lying within the boundary of Iron County.

GRAVEL CONFLICT: Mr. Hans Q. Chamberlain, County Attorney, discussed with the Board a proposal by D. W. Corry Real Estate Company to settle a long time dispute and legal conflict by and between them and Iron County over ownership and percentage equity in gravel removed from a pit located immediately north of Parowan City for use on construction of I-15. Following discussion at length, Mr. Chamberlain was authorized to attempt to negotiate a settlement which would, in his judgment, be fair and equitable under the circumstances.

ENGINEERING: Mr. Ralph B. Platt, Engineer for Project CR 29 (1), and Special Services Engineer for Iron County, appeared for discussion of a number of items.

First, he advised that CR Project 29(1) was now complete and suggested that the County Commissioners, in company with representatives from the Department of Transportation, inspect the Project for acceptance and approval. Following a brief discussion, such an inspection was scheduled for Tuesday, July 19th, at 4 P. M.

Secondly, Mr. Platt discussed at length problems related to proper preparation of subdivision plats, and the need for insistence on accuracy and compliance with regulations.

Third, the subject of County policy as related to the location, reestablishment, and remonumentation of Section corners was advanced for consideration. He advised that the policy in effect lacked adequate control, supervision, and inspection, for prevention of errors of considerable consequence. Accordingly, it was concluded by the Board to place the act of remonumentation under the direct supervision of the County, with monuments bearing County identification to be installed only upon County authorization and in accordance with County specifications. Metal corner pegs or posts to be placed under close supervision.

Fourth, Mr. Platt discussed with the Commissioners, projects, and project priorities, as related to Round II of the Economic Development Program. He, in accordance with recommendations made and to be made by the Commissioners, to assist in preparation of the basic and necessary information to be used in preparation and processing of the applications.

BID OPENING: Bids received in response to the Sheriff's invitation to bid on the furnishing of a specified type four wheel drive vehicle for use by his department in Western Iron County, were opened and read aloud. Bidding went as follows:

Lunt Motor Company Ramcharger \$6,687.00 U & S Motor Inc. Trail Duster 6,743.40 Bradshaw Chevrolet Bfazer 6,896.00

The bid of Lunt Motor Company appearing to, in all respects, meet specifications, was found by the Commissioners to be lowest and best, and in accordance with such findings, a motion was duly passed, which was made by Commissioner Cleo Wood and seconded by Chairman H. Grant Seaman, awarding the bid to them. RADAR EQUIPMENT: Mr. H. E. Christensen, Precinct Justice of Cedar City, presented

for and on behalf of the Utah Highway Patrol, a recommendation that Iron County plan to include in its next fiscal year budget provision for the purchase of Radar Equipment immune from detection by Truckers and others at great distances. The recommendation was accepted for consideration in connection with the preparation of the budget for the next fiscal period.

## TRAVEL

AUTHORIZED: Mr. LaMar Jensen, County Treasurer, requested & received authorization to attend a Work Shop for County Treasurers being held
at Beaver, July 14th, and 15th, 1977.

### COUNTY

GOVERNMENT: Mr. Robert Price of Midvalley, again appeared for purpose of encouraging the Commissioners to adopt his recommendations for the appointment of a Commission to study the advisability of and make recommendations for a reorganization of County Government. Following a discussion at length,

a motion was made by Commission Chairman, H. Grant Seaman providing that the request be tabled at this time, with the intent of adopting a resolution within a ninety day period preceding the 1978 General Election providing for presentation of the question to the voters of Iron County at the Gneral Election, "Shall a study Commission be established to study the present form of Government in Iron County, and to consider and make recommendations respecting the adoption of an optional plan of County Government". The motion was duly seconded by Commissioner Cleo Wood, and the vote thereon was as follows:

Chairman, H. Grant Seaman Commissioner, Cleo Wood Commissioner, James L. Clark Aye Aye Absent

In support of his motion Chairman H. Grant Seman had explained that he had investigated Utah County's experience with such a movement in 1976, and based on their experience, a considerable sum in taxpayers dollars could have been saved had they proceeded after the manner his motion provides for. Furthermore, by such a proceedure, the Commissioners not only learn as to whether or not the Citizens desire the study, but if so, that they are willing to assume the costs involved.

#### REIMBURSEMENT

UTILITY COSTS: Through Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, Mr. Boyd Adams, representing the Social Services Department of the Five County Association of Governments, requested that the Board of Iron County Commissioners advise him as to how they would prefer Iron County's allotment of \$27,610.00 to reimburse qualifying families for hardship caused by Utility costs, be administered. Following a brief review of the matter, a motion was unanamously passed, which was made by Commissioner Cleo Wood, and seconded by Chairman H. Grant Seaman, providing that the authority for administration of the program be delegated to the Five County Association Of Governments in as much as the Grant is channeled through them.

APPOINTMENT: A request was received by letter from the County Aging Council,
for authority to appoint Mr. Warren Spencer of Cedar City to
the Council on Aging. There being no objections, the request was approved. His
term to run to January 26th, 1980.

BOOK SHELVING: At the request of the Honorable, J. Harlan Burns, Judge of the Fifth Judicial District Court, Mr. John Rowley, Architect of Cedar City, presented plans, specifications, and estimated costs for installation of book shelves in the Judge's Chambers at the Courthouse, Parowan, Utah. Following a review of the material presented and on file in the matter, a motion was passed which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and duly seconded by Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, approving the project, subject to confirmation first

having been obtained from the Court, that the installation is timely and in full accord with his wishes in the matter.

#### AMENDMENT TO

SERVICE DISTRICT: In accordane with an action taken in regular Commissioners meeting of April 13th, 1977, County Attorney, Hans Q.

Chamberlain, presented for the Boards approval, an Ordinance modifying the area to be covered by the County Service District for solid waste disposal. The provisions of the Ordinance, as amended, were reviewed with Mr. Chamberlain and approved for publication. In substance, the Ordinance as amended, simply provided for the elimination of the Town of Summit and the Sanders Subdivision west of Quichapa Lake, from the geographical boundries of the original Service District. D. AND O.

contract : Mr. Chamberlain also advised that he had redrawn the Contract as between Iron County and D. and O. Sanitation in such manner as to reflect changes heretofore agreed upon relative to fees to be paid by Iron County for their Services. The Contract as redrawn, providing for a fee to be paid by Iron County to D. & O. Sanitation of \$3.00 per month per residence served rather than the \$3.50 per month as provided for under the original Contract, was examined and also approved.

## SERVICE DISTRICT

LITIGATION: Litigation pending with respect to the Solid Waste Disposal

Service District and matters related thereto, were also

discussed, and a conclusion reached to place D. and O. Sanitation on a ninety

day Contract cancellation notice, the execution of which would be dependent upon

results of the litigation.

ROAD MATTER ETC.: Mr. Clemont Adams of the Cedar City Stake Presidency, by
letter, petitioned the Board Of County Commissioners for
assistance with the installation of a Cattle guard at their ranch at Zane, and
for instructions as to materials etc. Furthermore, he requested assistance from
the County with the application of a brush killer spray along their fence line
in Cedar Valley.

After due consideration, the Commissioners agreed that if the Stake would supply the materials, Iron County would assist with the installation of the Cattle Guard, and that timber supports would be acceptable.

With respect to the brusk killer spray, however, they tabled any action thereon until the head of the weed Department and possibly the County Agent could be consulted.

These included seal-coating of Iron County's portion of Cedar Breaks to Panguitch Lake Road, resurfacing of road from Vandenberg Interchange VIA Kanarraville to I-15 south of Kanarraville, resurfacing of road from U-56 to Beryl, resurfacing road from South Summit Interchange VIA Summit to Parowan, an additional shelter at Woods Ranch Recreation Area, assistance to Cedar City in fencing Leigh Hill Reservoir, assist Parowan and Kanarra with water lines, assist Cedar City with foot bridge and road near Little League Park.

sioners for permission to construct a sewer line from Alma Evan's farm to the Parowan City system along or across such portions of the County Road right-of-way as may be affected. The request was approved subject to supervision by the County Building Inspector, and subject to the County being held harmless from any damages or cause of action resulting from the installation or maintenance of the facility.

Agency, appeared for purpose of explaining their program, and a proposal to set up a local council to identify needs and to set priorities, as a part and parcel of a study to be completed by May 1978. An eighteen (18) member Multi-County Council is recommended with representation from all segments. When study is completed, agency will channel expenditures into areas where need is demonstrated.

He explained that the Program is in effect in Iron County, providing three slots and a total appropriation of some \$2,970.00. In as much as his purpose in appearing was purely informative, no action was necessary or taken.

#### REORGANIZING

COUNTY GOVERNMENT: Mr. Robert Price, proponent of a move to establish a

After considerable discussion at this time and later in the meeting the Commissioners, on a two to one basis, concluded to stand on their previous decision to present the said question to the voters at the next General

Voting in the affirmative were:

In the negative, Commissioner, James L. Clark

A proposed analysis of costs necessary to present the question at the Municipal and at the same time as the Municipal Election, was made unnecessary since timely action was and has not been taken.

BRIAN HEAD : Mr. Wayne Iverson, representing Brian Head Town, again appeared relative to the possibility of obtaining a greater portion of E.D.A. funds allocated to Iron County than that represented by the \$77,000.00 top priority item. He was advised that their additional proposal would be submitted, but with priority of No. 9.

B.L.M. MATTER : A letter from the Bureau of Land Management, accompanied by an amended agreement on installation of cattle guards and maintenance of roads of mutual interest to B.L.M. and IronCounty, was presented for consideration. Upon examination, however, it was concluded to return it for clarification and revision before formal action is taken.

ROAD MATTERS . Mr. Lynn Fiack, County Road Supervisor, met the Board to advise them of and seek their counsel on a number of problems, including a complaint regarding right-of-way obtained from Charles Twitchell. in Section 33, Township 35 So. Range 16 West, SLB&M, request for improvement of a section of road in Monta Vista Subdivision, and a proposal to purchase a motor grader.

Commissioner, Cleo Wood, reported on the status of the Monta Vista road problem, and he and Road Supervisor, Lynn Fiack, agreed to investigate complaint pertaining to the Twitchell right-of-way, and benefits to accrue to the County, if any, from leasing rather than purchasing heavy road equipment.

E.D.A. FUND

APPLICATIONS \_: Mr. Ralph B. Platt, Engineer of Cedar City, reviewed with the Commissioners plans and specifications and project applications necessary to be submitted immediately in order for Iron County to meet the target date and qualify for E.D.A. funds alloted. Mr. Platt indicated that County priorities had been set up as follows:

# REGULAR AUGUST 24th, 1977, MEETING

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Board of Iron County Commissioners, held in Commission Chambers at the Courthouse, Parowan, Utah, August 24th, 1977, beginning at the hour of 9 A. M.

Officers in attendance were:

H. Grant Seaman, Commission Chairman Cleo Wood, Commissioner James L. Clark, Commissioner Clair Hulet, Clerk Hans Q. Chamberlain, Attorney

Invocation offered by Chairman, H. Grant Seaman.

Minutes of previous meeting, were read and approved subject to a minor correction.

INSURANCE PROGRAM: As the first matter of business, Mr. Richard Hollingshead,

Agent for Equitable Life, was given audience for the purpose
of presenting for the Board's consideration, a written proposal for a County H. &

A. Insurance Program. The report and proposal, following a brief discussion, was
placed on file as a sealed bid to be evaluated along with other proposals yest the be
submitted and the existing program.

FACILITIES STUDY: A proposal made or anticipated to be made, that \$5,000.00 of the agreed \$60,000.00 grant to be paid to I.H.C. by Iron

County as Capital Improvement Deposit, January 1st, 1978, be used to have a study made of the Valley View Medical Plant facility, was brought on for discussion, and the Board found themselves unanamously opposed to such an action at this time.

SOLID WASTE

DISPOSAL: Mrs. Marlene Culbertson, appeared relative to billings received in connection with solid waste disposal services they were receiving at their Ranch at Rush Lake. She submitted copies of billings in the sum of \$17.50 per month. The Commissioners, finding the Ranch to be situated within the service district, ruled that the Culbertsons should have been billed at the same rate as other residences within the district - \$3.75 per month for the first quarter of 1977, and \$3.50 per month thereafter. Subsequently, however, the Commissioners were informed that there were five families residing at the Ranch which would make the billing accurate, and further consideration advisable.

ELOOD CONTROL: Mr. Lynn Fiack, County Road Supervisor, reported to the

Commissioners that he had received a request from residents

of Kanarraville to clean the flood channel south of Kanarraville for the reason

that it is not now functioning properly and some homes had been flooded.

The Commissioners recommended that they problem first be reviewed with the Kanarra Town Board and a determination made as to whose jurisdiction the problem falls under. If damages occurred within the corporate limits of Kanarra Town, then the Town Board should take the initiative, and if County assistance is necessary, aarrangements should be worked out on a cooperative basis.

RIGHT-OF-WAY

PROBLEM: Commissioner, Cleo Wood, reported that he and County Road Supervisor, Lynn Fiack, had investigated the right-of-way problem raised by Mr. Charles Twitchell of Escalante Valley and presented at the previous meeting. Among other matters, he stated that Iron County has not and does not now intend to maintain the road located on the right-of-way, since it does not now serve the public and should be considered a private easement. Wherefore, he suggested that it be deleted from the County system, and the existing controversy be left for settlement among the Parties involved as a private matter.

The proposal was considered, and a conclusion reached to first determine as to whether or not Iron County does in fact hold title to the right-of-way, and to leave the matter status-quo until such a determination has been made.

ROAD MATTERS: By telephone, Mr. Max Hamilton of the U.S. Forest Service, requested the cooperation of Iron County in graveling the upper portion of the Red Creek Road. The County to do the work, and the Forest Service to pay cost. Following a review of the request, Road Supervisor, Lynn Fiack, was instructed to meet with Mr. Hamilton and work out details of a cooperative improvement agreement on this project, and also on the Page Ranch Road for submission for Commission approval.

Mr. Fiack, also presented for the Board's approval and recommendation, information on the purchase and/or rental of heavy road equipment. After the information had been evaluated, Mr. Fiack was authorized to obtain price quotations on type of motor grader desired and present for Commission review and action at the next meeting. Some consideration was given to planning for the purchase of a Crawler Tractor, but no formal action taken.

SOLID WASTE: A number of letters were received from residents of the

Solid Waste Disposal District, in substance, arguing that
they should not be required to pay the service charge if they haul their own
garbage. After a discussion of the administrative problems generated by such a
position, the Board agreed as policy that so long as the Ordinance creating the

service district is in full force and effect, Parties may be permitted to haul their own garbage, but every occupied residence must nevertheless pay the fee. They may make payment under protest, however, if they so desire.

REORGANIZATION

COUNTY GOVERNMENT: Mr. Robert Price again appeared in support of his effort
to get the question, "Do you favor the establishment of a

Commission to study the present form of County Government, and make a determination
as to whether or not a change is advisable?" on the municipal ballot come November.

Following, a discussion at length, a decision was reached to stand by the decision of the previous meeting.

Resources, appeared relative to their Cloud Seeding Program.

More especially to urge the Commission to support the program financially. Mr.

Summers spent considerable time explaining plans and objectives relative to the program and in answering questions. He stated that assessments would be prepared and submitted to the participating units in early November. TELEPHONE PROPOSAL: Mr. O. Kay Peterson, representing Mountain Bell Telephone

Company, presented in writing, a proposed Tela Lease
agreement for upgrading and improving the County telephone system. Upon examination of the lease, however, the Commission found a few basic questions for which they could not find a satisfactory answer. Wherefore they continued formal action on the matter to the next regular Commission meeting.

ENGINEER'S AGREEMENT: A representative of Ralph B. Platt, Engineer of Cedar

City, appeared and presented for approval and execution,
an Engineering Agreement by and between Iron County and Ralph B. Platt, Engineer,
dealing exclusively with engineering services related to projects to come under

## REGULAR SEPTEMBER 14th, 1977; MEETING

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

RIGHT-OF-WAY : As the first matter of business, audience was given to Charles Twitchell of Escalante Valley for consideration of an existing right-of-way or easement problem. As heretofore determined, the predecessor in interest to Mr. Twitchell to property he now owns in section 33, township 35 south, range 16 west, SLB&M, issued to Iron County a right-of-way deed as easement to the north two rods thereof for use in connection with the south two rods of the property adjoining on the north as a road right-of-way. Now since Iron County has never used or maintained a public road upon the easement and at this point in time has no intention of doing so, Mr. Twitchell requested that any interest the County may still retain in the property be returned to him. Accordingly, after due deliberation, a motion was unanamously passed, which was made by Commissioner, James L. TELEPHONE CONTRACT: The Commissioners reviewed a proposed 'Tela-Lease' agreement with Mountain Bell Telephone Company for upgrading equipment and County Telephone Service. Based upon information furnished by Kay Peterson, Mountain Bell representative, the Board viewed the proposal as not only an upgrading of equipment and service, but an ultimate substantial savings in costs. Grant Seaman, to execute the agreement for and on behalf of Iron County.

PUBLIC HEALTH: Mr. Bill Dawson, representing the Utah State Department of Health, appeared for the purpose of discussing with the Commissioners problems arising from the failure of subdividers to provide adequate water supply for many of the subdivisions in Iron County. He stated that, while he saw no specific legal action necessary at this time, if and should such necessity arise, would it not be more effective and obtain better cooperation from the Courts if handled on the local level. The matter was discussed at length, the County Attorney being present and participating, and a conclusion reached that legal proceedings could best be and should be handled by the State Department. Local cooperation to be expected, including an effort to subsequently more effectively implement the provision of the Subdivision Ordinance as related to this particular provision.

county Roads : Mr. Lynn Fiack, County Road Supervisor, met the Commissioners for purpose of reporting on price quotations which he had obtained on the cost of purchasing a new motor grader. He stated that the caterpillar grader could be obtained for a cost of \$66,100.00, and the John Deere for \$62,500.00. The request was tabled for further consideration. BRIAN HEAD : Mr. Steve Lutz, Fire Chief from Brian Head, appeared for purpose of discussing a number of items on which he sought County assistance.

First, he explained that they were experiencing considerable difficulty in obtaining a favorable insurance rating for the cause and reason that they have only one piece of fire fighting equipment, which is subject to call out of the corporate limits, and when it is absent on call the Town has no protection. Accordingly, he requested that the County assist them in obtaining another pumper truck. While the Board made no commitments, they did agree to help them obtain a back-up unit.

Secondly, Mr. Lutz presented a letter from the State Health Department, which in substance expressed deep concern over the numerous deficiencies and defects found on inspection of their sewage disposal system, and its attendant potential hazard in the way of water pollution, etc. Mr. Lutz explained that the system used until recently, of trucking the sewage down the canyon to the Parowan system, had failed, and while they are being temporarily served in like manner, the transport operator refuses to drive the canyon in inclement weather due to the danger involved. He further explained that the reasonbhe felt the County should feel some concern in this matter was based on the fact that a number of the large facilities at Brian Head are located outside the Town limits. While considerable discussion took place on the subject, no satisfactory solution was arrived at. It being generally the conclusion, however, that to transport was the only approach at this time, and if no other means of transportation is available, the City may have to obtain and operate its own equipment. The County of course, being willing to assist in any way they can in locating adequate equipment through surplus property, etc. but in no wise pledging further support at this time.

BOOKMOBILE: Through Commissioner, James L. Clark, the Commissioners were advised that Mr. Russell Shirts, Bookmobile Operator had requested approval for his honoring a request from the Parowan Elementary School to make Bookmobile service available to them. Following a brief discussion, the Board expressed themselves as having no objection to Mr. Shirts responding favorably to the request on a temporary or trial basis.

E.D.A. GRANTS: Grant offers from the Economic Development Administration to fund three proposed projects in Iron County, namely, a shelter at Woods Ranch Recreation Park at an estimated cost of some \$30,500.00, an alarm system at Valley View Medical Center at a cost estimate of \$15,850.00, and repair of three County Roads with a cost estimate of \$414,250.00, were called on for consideration.

The formal acceptance of the first two Grant offers to be filed with E.D.A. by September 30th, 1977, if in fact Iron County decides to accept the proffer, and response to the third item being required within thirty days from September 23rd, 1977, if it becomes Iron County's intent to accept.

Accordingly, the advisability of accepting or rejecting the proffer and award, was discussed at length, resulting in the unanamous approval of a motion made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and seconded by Commissioner, James L. Clark, providing that Chairman H. Grant Seaman, be authorized to execute, for and on behalf of Iron County, the formal acceptance of the said two offers of Grant, and the award of Grant, provided that subsequently care be taken in awarding bids to contractors for construction or installation, as the case may be, in each instance to protest the County from loss in event, for any reason Federal funding of the projects may be withdrawn or witheld in whole or in part.

GRAVEL SETTLEMENT: County Attorney, Hans Q. Chamberlain, advised the Board that he had received a counter proposal from Corry Real Estate, to settle the gravel controversy, being litigated by and between them and Iron County, for the sum of \$1,000.00. Mr. Chamberlain explained that, even though he felt the County's position in the matter was reasonably good, and the proffer considerably below the amount contemplated, serious thought should be given to settlement.

After most factors related to the matter had been reviewed, a motion was passed, which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and seconded by Commissioner, James L. Clark, authorizing acceptance.

SOCIAL SERVICES: Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, advised the Commission that Richard Garrett of the Department of Social Services, had extended an invitation to them to meet with him at his Office in Cedar City at their convenience. Accordingly it was concluded to accept the invitation and schedule it for October 7th, 1977, at 4 P. M. Mr. Seaman also stated that it was Mr. Garret's wish to meet with the Commissioners on occasions, and that he had advised him that he should arrange to be on the agenda on occasions when he wishes to attend.

CLOUD SEEDING: The subject of participating in the Cloud Seeding Program

for fiscal year 1977-78, came on for consideration.

Following a brief discussion, a motion was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, that

Iron County by-pass affiliation for the said period. The motion received no second, and was continued to the next meeting. In the meantime such members of

the Board as can will attend the meeting on Cloud Seeding scheduled at Beaver on Friday, September 30th, 1977.

#### WATER TRUCK

MATTER: Attention was called by Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, to an existing problem and controversy related to funding the balance due and owing on a Water Truck obtained and assembled by certain interested Citizens of Parowan for use by the various Civic Entities in connection with celebrations and activities conducted at the Parowan City Race Track and Rodeo Arena. He stated that he understood there to be a balance of some \$800.00 due which the promoters of the project feel Parowan City and Iron County should liquidate in accordance with their respective interests in activities conducted upon the said premises. Reference to the County interest being use of the facilities and need for the services of a Water Truck during the County Fair. In as much as the Board was not adequately informed as to all the pertinent facts related to the matter, by common consent, Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, was authorized to join with all interested parties in an effort to negotiate a settlement.

#### CITY & COUNTY

BUILDING: Considerable discussion took place regarding the status of Iron

County relative to the City and County Building on East Lincoln

Avenue, Cedar City, resulting from Cedar City's announced intention to move from and abandon the Building. No definate decisions were made, however, since such action would have to await resolving of a number of variable factors.

# SECRETARIAL

PAY SCALE: Mr. Hans Q. Chamberlain, County Attorney, requested authorization to raise the compensation rate for his legal Secretary to \$3.75 per hour. Explaining that she now has more than one years experience, and since she serves three parties, the impact of the raise on Iron County would not be substancial.

After discussion and due deliberation, the request was approved, effective as of September 1st, 1977.

After bills against the County had either been approved or rejected, the meeting was adjourned.

ANSWERING SERVICE: Mr. John Plestina of Cedar City, appeared seeking financial support for an answering service which he has or is in process of establishing. Requesting a flat fee or rate of \$100.00 per month from Iron County. The matter was discussed and tabled for review with the Valley View Medical Center's Board of Directors.

TAX MATTERS: Mr. H. Dee White, County Assessor, and Deputy Randall Day,

met the Commissioners for purpose of obtaining authorization for making refunds to a number of taxpayers for double or erroneous listings of personal

property. The items were comprised of the following:

# WOODS RANCH

RECREATION: Mr. Earl Hansen, of Cedar City representing the Kiwanis Club, advised the Board of problems they were experiencing at their Woods Ranch Skating Rink and proposed solutions. He stated that the Club personnel would be willing to do the work entailed, if and provided the County would provide the finance to cover costs, which he estimated would run at about \$350.00. The Commissioners, upon being advised that the 1977 budget would probably be sufficient to cover the specified amount, made the appropriation.

Mr. Hansen also requested that provision be made to care for the winter garbage. The Board agreed to investigate possibilities of a satisfactory arrangement.

TURN ABOUT: WickieeLeFevrean, met the Board for purpose of discussing the providing of and location of a School Bus turn about in connection with pickup of students from Fife Town Subdivision.. Since the area, where

she indicated the residents of the Subdivision preferred the turn about to be located, would require the obtaining of a right of way from Bauer Brothers, of Cedar City, and the upgrading of the right-of-way obtained, no definate action could be or was taken pending disposition of the right-of-way question. A meeting tasbe arranged for this purpose with the land owners.

Insurance Company, met briefly with the Board for purpose of submitting schedules covering increases in rates as provided in his original bid to furnish group coverage for Iron County, and to urge their consideration of bid proposals. The Commissioners agreed to arrange for an evaluation of bids received by a qualified and disinterested party, and to make a determination based upon his findings.

INFIRMARY: Mrs. Lasca Hunt, Lessee of the Iron County Rest Home,
reported on her findings thus far in obtaining new
draperies and furniture for the Home. She explained that in the case of the
furnishings she had concluded that re-upholstery was the better solution. The
Commissioners agreed and suggested that she obtain further quotes in both catagories and report her findings.

ROAD MATTERS: Mr. Lynn Fiack, County Road Supervisor, discussed a number of road matters with the Commissioners, including, but not limited to the following:

- 11. The recommendation of the State Road Department that Iron County use some of the Federal Aid Secondary Funds, to correct the manner of intersection of Old Highway 91 with U-130 at a point shortly north of the north Cedar City Interchange, as a safety measure. Following a discussion at length, the Board on a two to one basis, opposed the proposal. Chairman H. Grant Seaman being in favor, Commissioner, Cleo Wood and Mames L. Clark opposed.
- 2. A request from Norman Laub of Escalante Valley for permission to move a right-of-way easement crossing his property some 500 feet east from its present location, and that he profferedhaccess to a gravel pit as an incentive. Mr. Fiack stated that he favored the trade proposal. The Commissioners wanted time to become more familiar with factors related to the matter.

Other items, while informative, required no formal action.

APPOINTMENT: At request of the Cedar City Chamber of Commerce, Chairman

H. Grant Seaman was formally appointed to represent Iron

County on the Cedar City Industrial Park Commission.

ELEVISION: Mr. Elvin Webster, of Cedar City, Iron County Television

Service-man for Western Iron County, through Chairman H.

Grant Seaman, requested that Iron County either purchase or assist him in purchasing for use in his work in servicing Translators, a used Snow Cat at a cost of some \$2,200.00.

The Board, after discussion, felt that the request should be tabled pending an investigation of appropriate procedure as well as justifiable need for that type of equipment as related to this service. Furthermore, the possibility of justifiting the purchase of the equipment if also made available to the Sheriff's Department.

The suggestion was also made that the Commissioners consider the advisability of letting service contracts out on a bid basis.

WATER WAGON

: In response to authority given him at the previous meeting,

Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, reported to the Board that he
had met the Parowan City Council, and resolved, subject to their approval, the
controversy regarding payment of the balance owing on a Water Wagon prepared
for use at the City Race Track and otherwise by Parowan City and Iron County
as occasion may require. Chairman, Seaman stated that the agreement reached
was for Iron County to pay one half the balance due of \$898.69, and Parowan
City the other half.

Commission, Cleo Wood, and Commissioner, James L. Clark, approved the settlement as worked out and reported by Chairman, H. Grant Seaman.

COUNTY JAIL: Sheriff, Ira Schoppmann, presented for the Board's approval, a number of recommendations relative to the County Jail, occasioned by the abandonment of the City and County Building, on East Lincoln Avenue, Cedar City, and administration and maintenance of the Jail facility, by Cedar City Corporation.

- No. 1. He recommended that Mr. Jack Miller be appointed Deputy Sheriff and Jailer at a salary of \$826.00 per month, plus uniforms and fringe benefits as per existing County policy.
- No. 2. That Harl Adams, be appointed as a Deputy Sheriff and Assistant Jailer at his present salary of \$723.00 per month plus uniform allowance, and fringe as per present County policy.
- No. 3. That Joe Miner be appointed as anDeputy Sheriff and assistant Jailer at \$700.00 per month for probationary period plus uniform and standard fringe.

All recommendations were approved by motion unanamously passed, which was made by Commissioner, Cleo Wood, and seconded by Commissioner, James L. Clark

Other personnel that may be needed to properly man the facility to be determined by Sheriff Schoppmann, and subsequent appointments, subject to Commission approval, to be made.

E.D.A. GRANTS:

K.W. GENERATOR: Chairman, H. Grant Seaman, was duly authorized to implement proceedings necessary to get the call for bids out on Iron County's approved E.D.A. Projects. He was also authorized to take necessary steps to obtain the services of qualified personnel to install generator at the Valley View Medical Center.

EAWN MOWER: The Commissioners were advised that the County lawn mower had broken down, and the repair service had reported, with a badly scarred cylinder. Since this would require a return to the factory to determine responsibility for damage, and motor replacement chargeable to the County if the factory made a determination that the operator was responsible for damage, it was concluded to scrap it, and plan to purchase equipment of a size adequate for the job required.

After bills against the County had either been approved or rejected, the meeting was adjourned.

The Commissioners never-theless concluded to table the matter at least until a special meeting scheduled for December 8th, 1977.

representing the Southwest Health Department, appeared on invitation of the Board of Iron County Commissioners for an informative discussion and report on the activities of their Department. The report was detailed, covering the scope of their duties and obligations, as well as to pinpoint the type of existing problems; and those of greatest and most immediate concern. As indicated, the discussion was purely informative, calling for no formal action on the part of the Commissioners at this time, and none was taken.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: Parowan City Councilman, Frankie Lou Bentley, Frank Adams,

Councilman Elect, and Albert M. Orton, City Fire Chief, appeared for purpose of soliciting funds from Iron County to support their Fire Department and to assist in obtaining additional equipment. Specifically, the sum of \$5,000.00, a one-fourth interest in total cost anticipated to be necessary to obtain additional equipment programmed, \$500.00 for jackets, hats, etc. and \$1,000.00 toward maintenance of fire station which houses County and City equipment, and for miscellaneous supplies, etc. The request was tabled for review at time tentative budget is adopted.
